BDR 3-1374 proposes changes to NRS 2004.471 & 2004.481. Examples of the assaults covered by this proposed legislation would be the assault upon an umpire in Chicago in a recent season where a fan ran on the field and struck a first base umpire. Our data base indicates that there are 667 inmate records related to battery and assault. These records were reviewed and none of them were related to sports officials at sports events. To staff's knowledge there have been no similar incidents in Nevada for football, baseball, basketball, boxing, or another major sport. That does not preclude the possibility of acts of fan violence in the future. NDOC is unable to estimate the impact of the proposed legislation as there are no current inmates incarcerated for assaulting sports officials in the NDOC system and staff is unable to estimate the number of future persons who may be convicted of this offense, although it is likely to be few (in Chicago there were two persons involved in that incident) in number but we do not expect to receive an inmate from this legislation within the next four years.

BDR 3-1374 also proposes to revise NRS 41.630. The proposed legislation relates to civil damages and it should have no fiscal impact on NDOC.
