

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 224—ASSEMBLYMEN ANGLE, CARPENTER,
HOLCOMB, MORTENSON AND MUNFORD

MARCH 17, 2005

JOINT SPONSORS: SENATORS BEERS, CEGAVSKE AND WASHINGTON

Referred to Committee on Health and Human Services

SUMMARY—Prohibits person from administering or providing immunization which contains more than specified amount of mercury to certain persons.
(BDR 40-777)

AN ACT relating to public health; prohibiting a person from administering or providing an immunization which contains more than a specified amount of mercury to certain persons; providing exceptions; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

- 1 Existing law regulates certain aspects of maternal and child health. (Chapter
2 442 of NRS)
3 This bill prohibits a person from administering or providing an immunization to
4 another person, whether by vaccine or otherwise, if the immunization contains
5 more than a specified amount of mercury, unless the person obtains a signed
6 affirmation that the person receiving the immunization is not pregnant or under the
7 age of 3 years. This bill authorizes a person to request an exemption from this
8 prohibition which the Director of the Department of Human Resources, with the
9 concurrence of the Governor, may grant upon finding that the exemption is
10 necessary due to an actual or potential bioterrorism incident or a public health
11 emergency.
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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 442 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 ***1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, a person
4 shall not administer or provide to another person an immunization
5 that:***

6 ***(a) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (b), contains
7 more than 0.5 micrograms of mercury per 0.5 milliliter dose,
8 whether the immunization is administered by vaccination or
9 otherwise; or***

10 ***(b) Contains more than 1.0 microgram of mercury per 0.5
11 milliliter dose, if the immunization is against influenza and is
12 administered by vaccination,***

13 ***↳ without obtaining a signed document from the person receiving
14 the immunization, or the parent or guardian of the person if the
15 person receiving the immunization is less than 18 years of age,
16 affirming that the person receiving the immunization is not
17 pregnant or under the age of 3 years.***

18 ***2. The Director may, upon request, exempt a person from
19 complying with subsection 1 for a period not to exceed 12 months
20 if the Director finds and the Governor concurs that such an
21 exemption is necessary due to an actual or potential:***

22 ***(a) Incident of bioterrorism; or***

23 ***(b) Emergency involving the public health, including, without
24 limitation, an epidemic or shortage of an immunization that may
25 prevent a person who is pregnant or under the age of 3 years from
26 receiving an immunization.***

27 ***3. Not sooner than 30 days before the last day of the period
28 for which an exemption was granted pursuant to subsection 2, the
29 Director may extend the exemption for a period not to exceed 12
30 months if the Director finds and the Governor concurs that the
31 exemption continues to be necessary.***

32 ***4. If a person submits a written request to the Director for
33 notice of a request for or the granting or extension of an
34 exemption, the Director shall provide such notice to the person:***

35 ***(a) Upon receipt of a request for an exemption pursuant to
36 subsection 2.***

37 ***(b) Within 7 days after an exemption has been granted or
38 extended pursuant to subsection 2 or 3. The notice must include,
39 without limitation, an explanation of the findings that indicated
40 the need for the exemption.***

41 ***5. Not later than 48 hours after granting or extending an
42 exemption pursuant to subsection 2 or 3, the Director shall notify***



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1 *the Legislature if the Legislature is in session, or the Legislative*
2 *Commission if the Legislature is not in session, that the exemption*
3 *has been granted or extended and provide an explanation of the*
4 *findings that indicated the need for the exemption.*

5 *6. As used in this section, "person" includes, without*
6 *limitation, a government, governmental agency or political*
7 *subdivision of a government.*

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
