A.B. No. 22—Authorizes appointed trustees of city library to sell, exchange, transfer, assign or otherwise dispose of real or personal property of library.



## Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires the governing body of a city to determine whether to be the governing authority of the city library or to appoint a board of trustees to fill that role. If a board of trustees is appointed, the appointed trustees are required to perform certain acts to establish, maintain and manage the library. The appointed trustees are also authorized to perform certain acts necessary for the management and control of the library. (NRS 379.105)

This bill expands the authority of the appointed trustees of a city library to include making recommendations to the governing body of the city regarding the sale, exchange, transfer, assignment or other disposal of any real or personal property owned by the library or in which the library has an interest.
