S.B. No. 122—Authorizes certain public employees with active military service to purchase additional years of service in Public Employees' Retirement System.

Amend the bill as a whole by adding a new section designated sec. 4, following sec. 3, to read as follows:

"Sec. 4. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.".

Amend the title of the bill, third line, after "duty" by inserting:

"during Operation Enduring Freedom".

If this amendment is adopted, the Legislative

Counsel's Digest will be changed to read as follows:

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law establishes the Public Employees' Retirement System. The System provides benefits for the retirement, disability or death of employees of public employers and is funded on an actuarial reserve basis. (NRS 286.110) Under existing law, a member of the System may purchase all previous creditable service performed with his present employing agency if that service was performed before the enrollment of his agency in the System. Existing law also provides that a member of the System with 5 years of creditable service may purchase up to an additional 5 years of service. (NRS 286.300, 286.367)

This bill authorizes a member of the Public Employees' Retirement System who has 5 years of creditable service and who served on active military duty during Operation Enduring Freedom to purchase a number of months of service equal to the number of full months he served on active military duty during Operation Enduring Freedom, but the purchase may not exceed 3 years of service. The purchase is in addition to any other purchase of service credit authorized by law and is in addition to any free credit received for military service. To qualify for the purchase, the member must have been honorably discharged or released from active duty. The member must pay the full actuarial cost of the service.
