

SENATE BILL NO. 149—SENATOR LEE

MARCH 1, 2005

Referred to Committee on Human Resources and Education

SUMMARY—Makes various changes concerning Board of Regents of University of Nevada. (BDR 34-774)

AN ACT relating to the University and Community College System of Nevada; providing for a salary for members of the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada for attending meetings; making various changes regarding accounts established for members of the Board of Regents to pay for certain hosting expenditures; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law provides that members of the Board of Regents of the University
2 of Nevada serve without compensation. (NRS 396.070)

3 This bill entitles each member of the Board of Regents to receive a salary of
4 \$80 for each meeting of the Board that he attends.

5 This bill also establishes certain requirements governing the establishment and
6 use of an account for use by a member of the Board of Regents to pay for hosting
7 expenditures of the member to promote the University and Community College
8 System of Nevada.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 396.070 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 396.070 1. **[A] Each** member of the Board of Regents is
3 **[not]** entitled to receive **[any compensation for his services.] a**
4 **salary of \$80 for each meeting of the Board that he attends.**



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1 2. Each member of the Board of Regents is entitled to receive
2 in attending meetings of the Board, or while on Board of Regents'
3 business within the State:

4 (a) A per diem expense allowance not to exceed the greater of:
5 (1) The rate of \$60; or

6 (2) The maximum rate established by the Federal
7 Government for the locality in which the travel is performed.

8 (b) A travel allowance computed at the rate provided for state
9 officers and employees generally in subsection 3 of NRS 281.160.

10 **3. If an account is established for a member of the Board of
11 Regents to pay for hosting expenditures of the member:**

12 (a) *The annual expenditures from the account may not exceed
13 \$2,500.*

14 (b) *The account may be used only to pay for activities that are
15 directly related to the duties of the member of the Board of
16 Regents, including reasonable expenses for meals, beverages and
17 small gifts. The account must not be used to pay for expenses
18 associated with attending a sporting event or a political
19 fundraising event.*

20 (c) *The member of the Board of Regents must submit a
21 monthly report of expenditures from the account to the Chancellor
22 of the System. The report must include, without limitation, the
23 amount of money expended from the account, the specific purpose
24 and activity for which the money was expended and, if applicable,
25 the person for whom the money was expended.*

26 (d) *The Chancellor of the System shall compile the monthly
27 reports into an annual report on or before January 30 of each
28 year. The monthly reports and annual reports are public records
29 and must be made available for public inspection.*

30 **4. As used in this section, "hosting expenditures" means
31 reasonable expenses by or on behalf of a member of the Board of
32 Regents who is conducting business activities necessary to provide
33 a benefit to the System by establishing goodwill, promoting
34 programs of the System or otherwise advancing the mission of the
35 System.**

36 **Sec. 2.** NRS 396.080 is hereby amended to read as follows:

37 396.080 The Board of Regents shall have the power to appoint
38 a Chairman. ~~[, who shall receive no compensation for his services
39 as Chairman.]~~

40 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2005.
