SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing practice of barbering, cosmetology and related professions. (BDR 54-1356)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to professions; authorizing the State Barbers' Health and Sanitation Board to seek injunctive relief and issue citations for certain violations; providing for a temporary exemption from licensure as a barber or apprentice under certain circumstances: barber's prohibiting certain unlawful acts relating to the practice of barbering; giving the State Barbers' Health and Sanitation Board jurisdiction over cosmetologists who commit certain unlawful acts relating to the practice of barbering; limiting the number of consecutive terms a member of the State Board of Cosmetology may serve in a given period; revising provisions governing the disclosure of information by the State Board of Cosmetology; revising provisions governing the examination, training and licensure of persons who practice cosmetology and related professions; revising various provisions governing the regulation of cosmetological establishments and schools of cosmetology; revising provisions governing disciplinary action taken by the State Board of Cosmetology; increasing certain fees and fines; providing remedies and penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.



THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 643 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act.

3 Sec. 2. 1. In addition to any other remedy or penalty, if a 4 person has engaged in any act or practice which constitutes a 5 violation of any provision of this chapter, the district court of any 6 county, on application of the Board, may issue an injunction or 7 other appropriate order restraining the act or practice, without a 8 showing of actual harm.

9 2. A proceeding under this section is governed by Rule 65 of 10 the Nevada Rules of Civil Procedure.

Sec. 3. 1. In addition to any other remedy or penalty:

12 (a) The Board may issue a citation to a person who has engaged in any act or practice which constitutes a violation of any 13 provision of NRS 643.190. A citation issued pursuant to this 14 paragraph must be in writing and describe with particularity the 15 nature of the violation. The citation also must inform the person 16 of the provisions of subsection 2. A separate citation must be 17 issued for each violation. If appropriate, the citation may contain 18 19 an order to cease and desist.

(b) Upon finding that a person has engaged in any act or
practice which constitutes a violation of any provision of NRS
643.190, the Board shall assess an administrative fine of:

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For the first violation, \$1,000.
 For the second violation, \$1,500.

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(2) For the second violation, \$1,500.
(3) For the third or subsequent violation, \$2,000.

26 2. To appeal a finding of a violation pursuant to this section, 27 the person must request a hearing by written notice of appeal to 28 the Board within 30 days after the date on which the citation is 29 issued.

30 Sec. 4. 1. The actions and remedies authorized by this 31 chapter are cumulative.

2. When an agency or officer elects to take a particular action or pursue a particular remedy authorized by this chapter or another specific statute, that election is not exclusive and does not preclude the agency or officer or another agency or officer from taking any other actions or pursuing any other remedies authorized by this chapter or another specific statute.

After the applicant 34 35 has submitted the application, the applicant must contact the Board and request a verbal review concerning the application to determine 36 37 if the cosmetological establishment complies with the requirements of this chapter and the regulations adopted by the Board. If, based 38 on the verbal review, the Board determines that the cosmetological 39 40 establishment meets those requirements, the Board shall issue to 41 the applicant the required license. Upon receipt of the license, the 42 applicant must contact the Board to request the activation of the license. A license issued pursuant to this subsection is not valid until 43 44 it is activated. The Board shall conduct an on-site inspection of the



cosmetological establishment not later than 90 days after the date on 1 2 which the license is activated.

TEXT OF REPEALED SECTIONS

644.425 Temporary educational permit; unlawful acts.

1. The Board may grant a temporary educational permit authorizing a current licensee within the scope of his license to conduct demonstrations and exhibitions, temporarily and primarily for educational purposes, of techniques for the benefit and instruction of cosmetologists, hair designers, aestheticians, electrologists and manicurists licensed pursuant to this chapter, and electrologists' apprentices, cosmetologists' apprentices and students enrolled in licensed schools of cosmetology.

2. The permit must specify the purpose for which it is granted, the period during which the person is permitted to conduct the demonstrations and exhibitions, which may not exceed 10 days, and the time and place of exercising the privilege granted by the permit.

3. A person may be granted a temporary educational permit only if he:

(a) Applies to the Board for the permit;

(b) Demonstrates to the satisfaction of the Board that the permit is sought primarily for educational purposes; and

(c) Pays a fee of not less than \$10 and not more than \$25.

 \rightarrow Except for schools licensed pursuant to this chapter, an application for a permit must be submitted at least 10 days before the date of the demonstration or exhibit.



4. It is unlawful:

(a) For any person to conduct a demonstration or exhibition without a permit.

(b) For any person who is granted a permit to allow persons other than cosmetologists, hair designers, aestheticians, electrologists and manicurists licensed pursuant to this chapter, and electrologists' apprentices, cosmetologists' apprentices and students enrolled in licensed schools of cosmetology to attend any demonstration or exhibition made or given by him.

644.477 Unlawful to practice other professions in cosmetological establishment; exceptions. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 644.360, it is unlawful for the operator of a cosmetological establishment to practice or allow the practice of any profession other than cosmetology in that establishment.

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
