
AN ACT relating to education; creating the Commission on Educational Excellence; prescribing the membership and duties of the Commission; creating the Trust Fund for Educational Excellence; authorizing school districts and charter schools to apply for participation in the Commission's program of educational excellence and to receive an allocation of money from the Trust Fund to improve the achievement of pupils in kindergarten through grade 6; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 385 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 9, inclusive, of this
3 act.

4 **Sec. 2.** *As used in sections 2 to 9, inclusive, of this act, unless
5 the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in
6 sections 3 and 4 of this act have the meanings ascribed to them in
7 those sections.*

8 **Sec. 3.** *“Commission” means the Commission on
9 Educational Excellence created pursuant to section 5 of this act.*



1 **Sec. 4. "Trust Fund" means the Trust Fund for Educational
2 Excellence created pursuant to section 9 of this act.**

3 **Sec. 5. 1. The Commission on Educational Excellence,
4 consisting of seven members, is hereby created. The
5 Superintendent of Public Instruction shall serve as an ex officio
6 member of the Commission. The Governor shall appoint the
7 following members to the Commission:**

8 (a) *Two teachers who provide instruction at public elementary
9 schools;*

10 (b) *Two principals of public elementary schools;*

11 (c) *One administrator of a school district; and*

12 (d) *One member of the general public.*

13 → *The Governor shall appoint a Chairman from among the
14 members he appoints.*

15 2. *After the initial terms, the term of each appointed member
16 of the Commission is 2 years, commencing on January 1 of the
17 year he is appointed and expiring on December 31 of the
18 immediately following year. A member shall continue to serve on
19 the Commission until his successor is appointed. Upon the
20 expiration of a term of a member, he may be reappointed if he still
21 possesses any requisite qualifications for appointment. There is no
22 limit on the number of terms that a member may serve.*

23 3. *The Commission shall hold at least four regular meetings
24 each year and may hold special meetings at the call of the
25 Chairman.*

26 4. *Members of the Commission serve without compensation,
27 except that for each day or portion of a day during which a
28 member of the Commission attends a meeting of the Commission
29 or is otherwise engaged in the business of the Commission, he is
30 entitled to receive the per diem allowance and travel expenses
31 provided for state officers and employees generally.*

32 5. *The Department shall provide:*

33 (a) *Administrative support;*

34 (b) *Equipment; and*

35 (c) *Office space,*

36 → *as is necessary for the Commission to carry out its duties.*

37 **Sec. 6. The Commission shall:**

38 1. *Establish a program of educational excellence designed
39 exclusively for pupils enrolled in kindergarten through grade 6 in
40 the public schools in this State based upon:*

41 (a) *The plan to improve the achievement of pupils prepared by
42 the State Board pursuant to NRS 385.34691;*

43 (b) *The plan to improve the achievement of pupils prepared by
44 the board of trustees of each school district pursuant to
45 NRS 385.348;*



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1 (c) *The plan to improve the achievement of pupils prepared by
2 the principal of each elementary school pursuant to NRS 385.357
3 and, as deemed necessary by the Commission, those plans for
4 improvement prepared for middle schools, junior high schools and
5 high schools; and*

6 (d) *Any other information that the Commission considers
7 relevant to the development of the program of educational
8 excellence.*

9 2. *Develop procedures for the submission of applications by
10 school districts and charter schools that desire to participate in the
11 program of educational excellence and criteria for eligibility to
12 participate in the program. A school district or charter school that
13 is accepted for participation in the program may be approved by
14 the Commission for participation for a period not to exceed 2
15 years.*

16 3. *Prescribe a long-range timeline for the review, approval
17 and evaluation of applications received from school districts and
18 charter schools that desire to participate in the program.*

19 4. *Prescribe accountability measures to be carried out by a
20 school district or charter school that participates in the program if
21 that school district or charter school does not meet the annual
22 measurable objectives established by the State Board pursuant to
23 NRS 385.361.*

24 5. *Determine the amount of money that is available from the
25 Trust Fund for those school districts and charter schools that are
26 selected to participate in the program.*

27 6. *Allocate money to school districts and charter schools from
28 the Trust Fund.*

29 7. *Establish criteria for school districts and charter schools
30 that participate in the program and receive an allocation of money
31 from the Trust Fund to evaluate the effectiveness of the allocation
32 in improving the achievement of pupils, including, without
33 limitation, a detailed analysis of:*

34 (a) *The achievement of pupils enrolled at each school that
35 received money from the allocation based upon measurable
36 criteria identified in the plan to improve the achievement of pupils
37 for the school prepared pursuant to NRS 385.357; and*

38 (b) *If applicable, the achievement of pupils enrolled in the
39 school district as a whole, based upon measurable criteria
40 identified in the plan to improve the achievement of pupils for the
41 school district prepared pursuant to NRS 385.348.*

42 Sec. 7. 1. *A school district or charter school that receives
43 an allocation of money from the Trust Fund shall:*

44 (a) *Account for the money separately;*



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1 (b) Use the money to supplement and not replace the money
2 that would otherwise be expended by the school district or charter
3 school, as applicable, for the achievement of pupils in
4 kindergarten through grade 6; and

5 (c) Submit an evaluation of the effectiveness of the allocation
6 in improving the achievement of pupils in kindergarten through
7 grade 6 in accordance with the criteria for evaluation established
8 by the Commission pursuant to section 6 of this act.

9 2. A school district or charter school that receives an
10 allocation of money from the Trust Fund shall not:

11 (a) Use the money to settle or arbitrate disputes or negotiate
12 settlements between an organization that represents licensed
13 employees of the school district or charter school and the school
14 district or charter school, as applicable.

15 (b) Use the money to adjust the schedules of salaries and
16 benefits of the employees of the school district or charter school,
17 as applicable.

18 **Sec. 8. The Commission shall:**

19 1. Prepare an annual report that describes the activities of the
20 Commission and an analysis of the progress of the:

21 (a) School districts and charter schools in carrying out the
22 plans to improve the achievement of pupils; and

23 (b) School districts, individual schools within each school
24 district and charter schools that received an allocation of money
25 from the Trust Fund in improving the achievement of pupils.

26 2. On or before December 1 of each year, submit the annual
27 report to the:

28 (a) State Board;

29 (b) Governor;

30 (c) Committee;

31 (d) Bureau; and

32 (e) Superintendent of Public Instruction.

33 **Sec. 9. 1. The Trust Fund for Educational Excellence is**
34 **hereby created in the State General Fund, to be administered by**
35 **the Superintendent of Public Instruction. The Superintendent of**
36 **Public Instruction may accept gifts and grants of money from any**
37 **source for deposit in the Trust Fund. Any money from gifts and**
38 **grants may be expended in accordance with the terms and**
39 **conditions of the gift or grant, or in accordance with subsection 2.**
40 **The interest and income earned on the money in the Trust Fund**
41 **must be credited to the Trust Fund.**

42 2. The money in the Trust Fund may only be used for the
43 allocation of money to school districts and charter schools that are
44 selected for participation in the program of educational excellence
45 established by the Commission pursuant to section 6 of this act.



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1 **Sec. 10.** NRS 385.3455 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 385.3455 As used in NRS 385.3455 to 385.391, inclusive, ***and***
3 ***sections 2 to 9, inclusive, of this act,*** unless the context otherwise
4 requires, the words and terms defined in NRS 385.346 to
5 385.34675, inclusive, have the meanings ascribed to them in those
6 sections.

7 **Sec. 11.** On or before September 1, 2005, the Governor shall
8 appoint to the Commission on Educational Excellence created
9 pursuant to section 5 of this act:

10 1. One teacher, one principal and one school administrator to
11 terms commencing on September 1, 2005, and expiring on
12 December 30, 2006.

13 2. One teacher, one principal and one member of the general
14 public to terms commencing on September 1, 2005, and expiring on
15 December 30, 2007.

16 **Sec. 12.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2005.
