## INTRODUCTION, FIRST READING AND REFERENCE

By Assemblyman Carrillo:

Assembly Bill No. 119—AN ACT relating to industrial insurance; revising provisions governing the duty of certain insurers to accept or deny certain claims for compensation by police officers, firefighters and arson investigators; revising the standard of proof required for a police officer, firefighter or arson investigator to be entitled to compensation for an industrial injury; revising certain limitations on actions by police officers, firefighters and arson investigators for violations of the Nevada Industrial Insurance Act and the Nevada Occupational Diseases Act; revising provisions governing certain claims for compensation for the occupational diseases of cancer, lung disease, heart disease and hepatitis; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblyman Carrillo moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Commerce and Labor.

By Assemblymen Krasner, Hambrick and Spiegel:

Assembly Bill No. 120—AN ACT relating to crimes; revising provisions relating to the crimes of sex trafficking and solicitation of a child for prostitution; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblywoman Krasner moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

By Assemblyman Daly:

Assembly Bill No. 121—AN ACT relating to public office; revising provisions governing the lobbying of State Legislators; revising provisions governing financial disclosure statements filed by candidates and public officers; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblyman Daly moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections.

Motion carried.

By the Committee on Health and Human Services:

Assembly Bill No. 122—AN ACT relating to Medicaid; requiring the Department of Health and Human Services to seek a waiver from federal requirements so that certain care provided at a rural facility operated by the Department may be included as medical assistance in the State Plan for Medicaid; requiring certain reports concerning the waiver to be made; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblyman Sprinkle moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services.

By Assemblywoman Munk:

Assembly Bill No. 123—AN ACT relating to education; requiring certain information regarding exemptions from immunization requirements for pupils to be submitted to certain public health agencies; requiring an annual statement regarding medical exemptions to be submitted to the board of trustees of a school district or the governing body of a school; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblywoman Munk moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Education.

Motion carried.

By Assemblywomen Munk and Gorelow:

Assembly Bill No. 124—AN ACT relating to health care; requiring a hospital or independent center for emergency medical care to adopt a written plan to ensure the performance of certain tasks when treating a female victim of sexual assault; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblywoman Munk moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Health and Human Services.

Motion carried.

By Assemblymen Neal, Flores and McCurdy:

Assembly Bill No. 125—AN ACT relating to criminal procedure; revising provisions governing factors to be considered by the court in deciding whether

to release a person without bail; prohibiting a court from relying solely on a bail schedule in setting the amount of bail after a personal appearance by a defendant; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Assemblywoman Neal moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.
