ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 74—COMMITTEE ON NATURAL RESOURCES, AGRICULTURE, AND MINING

(ON BEHALF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE)

Prefiled November 20, 2018

Referred to Committee on Natural Resources, Agriculture, and Mining

SUMMARY—Makes it unlawful for a person to engage in the business of buying, selling, trading or dealing in certain antlers or any head or skull of a big game mammal without first obtaining an antler dealer's license. (BDR 45-208)

AN ACT relating to wildlife; making it unlawful for a person to engage in the business of buying, selling, trading or dealing in certain antlers or any head or skull of a big game mammal without first obtaining an antler dealer's license; providing an exception; setting forth the fee for issuing such a license; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Under existing law, it is unlawful for any person to: (1) sell or expose for sale, barter, trade or purchase or attempt to sell, barter, trade or purchase any species of wildlife, or parts thereof, with certain exceptions; or (2) capture or destroy any game mammal, other than a carnivore, and detach or remove from the carcass the head, hide, antlers, horns or tusks and leave the carcass to waste. (NRS 501.379, 503.050) Existing law also: (1) makes it unlawful for any person to engage in the business of buying, selling, trading or dealing in any raw skins or pelts of any wild animal without first obtaining a fur dealer's license; and (2) sets forth the fee for the issuance of such a license. (NRS 502.240, 505.010) **Section 2** of this bill makes it unlawful for a person to engage in the business of buying, selling, trading or dealing in any antlers of a big game mammal which are not naturally shed or any





head or skull of a big game mammal without first obtaining an antler dealer's license. **Section 2** exempts the holder of a license to practice commercial taxidermy from the requirement to obtain an antler dealer's license. **Section 1** of this bill sets forth the fee for the issuance of an antler dealer's license. **Sections 3-6** of this bill make conforming changes.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Except as otherwise provided in subsection 5, the Department shall issue an annual resident specialty combination hunting and fishing license pursuant to this chapter upon satisfactory proof of the requisite facts and the payment of a fee of \$15 to:
- (a) Any person who has been considered to be a resident of this State pursuant to NRS 502.015 continuously for the 5 years immediately preceding the date of application for the license and is 65 years of age or older.
- (b) Any person who is a resident of this State pursuant to NRS 502.015 and who has a severe physical disability.
- (c) Any person who is a resident of this State pursuant to NRS 502.015 and who has incurred a service-connected disability specified in NRS 502.072.
- 5. The Department shall issue an annual resident specialty combination hunting and fishing license pursuant to this chapter upon satisfactory proof of the requisite facts and the payment of a fee of \$10 to any resident Native American of this State pursuant to NRS 502.280.
- 6. The Department shall issue *a permit, license or other authorization* to any person, without regard to residence, upon the payment of a fee of:

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7. As used in this section, "severe physical disability" means a physical disability which materially limits a person's ability to engage in gainful employment.

Sec. 2. NRS 505.010 is hereby amended to read as follows:

505.010 1. [It] Except as otherwise provided in this section, it is unlawful for any person to engage in, carry on or conduct wholly or in part the business of buying, selling, trading or dealing [...] in, within this State, [in the]:

(a) Any raw skins or pelts of any wild mammal without first obtaining a fur dealer's license pursuant to NRS 502.240 [-]; or

- (b) Any antlers of a big game mammal which are not naturally shed or any head or skull of a big game mammal without first obtaining an antler dealer's license pursuant to NRS 502.240.
- 2. If the dealer resides in, or if the dealer's principal place of business is within this State, the dealer is a resident fur dealer or resident antler dealer, as applicable.
- 3. All other fur dealers *or antler dealers* are nonresident fur dealers ... *or nonresident antler dealers, as applicable.*
- 4. The provisions of paragraph (b) of subsection 1 do not apply to the holder of a license to practice commercial taxidermy.
- 5. The Commission may adopt regulations concerning the licensing, operating and recordkeeping of fur dealers [...] and antler dealers.





Sec. 3. NRS 505.015 is hereby amended to read as follows: 505.015 An application for the issuance of a fur dealer's license *or an antler dealer's license* must include the social security

4 number of the applicant.

Sec. 4. $NR\hat{S}$ 505.025 is hereby amended to read as follows:

505.025 The Department shall, upon request of the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services of the Department of Health and Human Services, submit to the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services the name, address and social security number of each person who holds a fur dealer's license or an antler dealer's license and any pertinent changes in that information.

Sec. 5. NRS 505.035 is hereby amended to read as follows:

505.035 1. If the Department receives a copy of a court order issued pursuant to NRS 425.540 that provides for the suspension of all professional, occupational and recreational licenses, certificates and permits issued to a person who is the holder of a fur dealer's license [.] or an antler dealer's license, the Department shall deem the license issued to that person to be suspended at the end of the 30th day after the date on which the court order was issued unless the Department receives a letter issued to the holder of the license by the district attorney or other public agency pursuant to NRS 425.550 stating that the holder of the license has complied with the subpoena or warrant or has satisfied the arrearage pursuant to NRS 425.560.

- 2. The Department shall reinstate a fur dealer's license *or an antler dealer's license* that has been suspended by a district court pursuant to NRS 425.540 if the Department receives a letter issued by the district attorney or other public agency pursuant to NRS 425.550 to the person whose license was suspended stating that the person whose license was suspended has complied with the subpoena or warrant or has satisfied the arrearage pursuant to NRS 425.560.
 - **Sec. 6.** NRS 505.045 is hereby amended to read as follows:

505.045 1. In addition to any other requirements set forth in this chapter, an applicant for the renewal of a fur dealer's license or an antler dealer's license must indicate in the application submitted to the Department whether the applicant has a state business license. If the applicant has a state business license, the applicant must include in the application the business identification number assigned by the Secretary of State upon compliance with the provisions of chapter 76 of NRS.

- 2. A fur dealer's license *or an antler dealer's license* may not be renewed by the Department if:
- (a) The applicant fails to submit the information required by subsection 1; or





- (b) The State Controller has informed the Department pursuant to subsection 5 of NRS 353C.1965 that the applicant owes a debt to an agency that has been assigned to the State Controller for collection and the applicant has not:
 - (1) Satisfied the debt;

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- (2) Entered into an agreement for the payment of the debt pursuant to NRS 353C.130; or
 - (3) Demonstrated that the debt is not valid.
 - 3. As used in this section:
 - (a) "Agency" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 353C.020.
 - (b) "Debt" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 353C.040.
 - **Sec. 7.** This act becomes effective:
- 1. Upon passage and approval for the purpose of adopting any regulations and performing any other preparatory administrative tasks necessary to carry out the provisions of this act; and
 - 2. On July 1, 2019, for all other purposes.
