SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing local emergency management. (BDR 36-355)

AN ACT relating to emergency management; creating the Nevada Tribal Emergency Coordinating Council; prescribing the membership and duties of the Council; revising provisions governing a local organization for emergency management; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires the Chief of the Division of Emergency Management of 123456789 the Department of Public Safety to coordinate the activities of all organizations for emergency management within Nevada. (NRS 414.040) Section 1 of this bill creates the Nevada Tribal Emergency Coordinating Council within the Division. Section 1 requires the Chief of the Division to appoint not more than 27 members to the Council, each of whom must be a member of a different federally recognized Indian tribe or nation which is located within Nevada. Section 1 requires the Council to: (1) advise the Chief regarding emergency management on tribal lands; (2) assist in the coordination of mitigation, preparedness, response and recovery activities relating to an emergency on tribal lands; and (3) submit an annual report 10 to the Chief detailing the Council's activities during the immediately preceding 11 12 calendar year and recommendations relating to emergency management on tribal 13 lands.

Existing law authorizes each county and city in Nevada to establish a local organization for emergency management. A local organization for emergency management is responsible for performing functions of emergency management





17 within the territorial limits of the political subdivision within which it is organized 18 and, if required, outside those territorial limits. (NRS 414.090) Section 2 of this bill 19 makes it mandatory for a county to establish a local organization for emergency 20 management, but, in lieu of each county establishing its own local organization for 21 22 23 emergency management, section 2 authorizes the boards of county commissioners of two or more counties to enter into an interlocal agreement establishing one local organization for emergency management for all the counties that are parties to the $\bar{2}4$ agreement.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 414 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 The Nevada Tribal Emergency Coordinating Council, 1. 4 consisting of not more than 27 members appointed by the Chief, is 5 hereby created within the Division of Emergency Management of the Department of Public Safety. The Chief shall appoint each 6 member from a different federally recognized Indian tribe or 7 8 nation, all or part of which is located within the boundaries of this 9 State. Not more than one member of the Council may be from the same federally recognized Indian tribe or nation. 10 The term of office of each member of the Council is 2 11 2. 12 vears.

The Council shall meet at the call of the Chief and at least 13 3. 14 once every 3 months.

15 *4*. The Division of Emergency Management shall provide the 16 Council with administrative support.

17 5. The Council shall:

(a) Advise the Chief regarding emergency management on 18 19 tribal lands;

(b) Assist in the coordination of mitigation, preparedness, 20 21 response and recovery activities related to an emergency on tribal 22 lands: and

23 (c) Submit an annual report to the Chief on or before 24 January 31 of each year which must include, without limitation:

25 (1) A summary of the activities of the Council during the 26 immediately preceding calendar year; and

27 (2) Recommendations relating to emergency management 28 on tribal lands.

29 **6**. The Attorney General shall enter into any agreements 30 necessary to carry out the provisions of this section. 31

Sec. 2. NRS 414.090 is hereby amended to read as follows:

32 414.090 1. [Each political subdivision] Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, each county of this state shall, and each 33 *city* of this state may, establish a local organization for emergency 34





1 management in accordance with the state emergency management 2 plan and program for emergency management. Such a political 3 subdivision may confer or authorize the conferring upon members 4 of the auxiliary police the powers of police officers, subject to such 5 restrictions as it imposes. Each local organization for emergency 6 management must have a director who must be appointed by the 7 executive officer or governing body of the political subdivision, and 8 who has direct responsibility for the organization, administration 9 and operation of the local organization for emergency management 10 subject to the direction and control of the executive officer or 11 governing body. Each local organization for emergency 12 management shall perform functions of emergency management 13 within the territorial limits of the political subdivision within which it is organized, and, in addition, shall conduct such functions outside 14 of such territorial limits as may be required pursuant to the 15 16 provisions of NRS 414.100.

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17 2. In lieu of establishing a local organization for emergency 18 management pursuant to subsection 1, the boards of county 19 commissioners of two or more counties may enter into an 20 interlocal agreement that:

21 (a) Establishes local organization for a emergency 22 management for the counties that are parties to the agreement; 23 and 24

(b) Ensures compliance with the requirements of subsection 1.

25 In carrying out the provisions of this chapter, each political 3. 26 subdivision in which any emergency or disaster described in NRS 27 414.020 occurs may enter into contracts and incur obligations 28 necessary to combat such an emergency or disaster, protect the 29 health and safety of persons and property and provide emergency 30 assistance to the victims of such an emergency or disaster. Each 31 political subdivision may exercise the powers vested under this section in the light of the exigencies of the extreme emergency or 32 33 disaster without regard to time-consuming procedures and 34 formalities prescribed by law, except constitutional requirements, pertaining to the performance of public work, entering into 35 36 contracts, the incurring of obligations, the employment of temporary 37 workers, the rental of equipment, the purchase of supplies and 38 materials, the levying of taxes, and the appropriation and 39 expenditure of public funds.

40 **Sec. 3.** The provisions of NRS 354.599 do not apply to any 41 additional expenses of a local government that are related to the 42 provisions of this act.

43 **Sec. 4.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
