SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing purchasing by a county hospital and a hospital in a county hospital district. (BDR 40-488)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to hospitals; revising provisions governing purchasing by a county hospital and a hospital in a county hospital district; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law authorizes a county hospital or a hospital in a county hospital district to purchase supplies, materials and equipment through the purchasing contracts of the company that manages the hospital, if applicable, or through a purchasing group in which the hospital is a member without complying with the competitive bidding requirements in the Local Government Purchasing Act if: (1) the prices for the supplies, materials or equipment were obtained through a process of competitive bidding; and (2) the governing body of the county hospital or the board of trustees of the hospital district, as applicable, determines that the purchase price is lower than the lowest price that could be attained through the competitive bidding process set forth in the Local Government Purchasing Act. (NRS 450.191, 450.525, 450.530, 450.720, 450.725, 450.730)

12 This bill includes services in the types of purchases that a county hospital or 13 district hospital is authorized to make through the purchasing contracts of the company that runs the hospital, if applicable, or through a purchasing group 14 15 without complying with the competitive bidding requirements in the Local Government Purchasing Act or for public works. This bill additionally requires the 16 17 governing body of a county hospital or the board of trustees of a hospital district to 18 ensure that if the services to be purchased are for work on a project that qualifies as 19 a public work, the prevailing wages will be paid for those services.





THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 450.008 is hereby amended to read as follows: 450.008 "Purchasing group" means a cooperative organization of hospitals and other health care organizations that affiliate for the purpose of combining their purchasing power to secure a lower cost for their purchases of supplies, materials , [and] equipment *and services* than would be available to the members of the purchasing group individually.

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Sec. 2. NRŠ 450.191 is hereby amended to read as follows:

9 450.191 1. The governing body of a county hospital may 10 contract with a company which manages hospitals for the rendering 11 of management services in a county hospital under the ultimate 12 authority of the governing body.

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2. The agreement may provide:

(a) That the administrator of the hospital must be an employeeof the company which manages the hospital; and

(b) That the hospital may, in accordance with the requirements of NRS 450.530, purchase supplies, materials, [and] equipment *and services* through the purchasing contracts of the company which manages the hospital, or through a purchasing group, without complying with the requirements for competitive bidding set forth in [chapter] chapters 332 and 338 of NRS.

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Sec. 3. NRS 450.525 is hereby amended to read as follows:

450.525 1. A county hospital may, with the approval of the
governing body of the hospital, become a member of a purchasing
group for the purpose of purchasing supplies, materials , [and]
equipment *and services* used by the county hospital.

27 2. A county hospital that becomes a member of a purchasing 28 group may, in accordance with the requirements of NRS 450.530, 29 purchase supplies, materials, [and] equipment *and services* through 30 the purchasing group without complying with the requirements for 31 competitive bidding set forth in [chapter] chapters 332 and 338 of 32 NRS.

Sec. 4. NRS 450.530 is hereby amended to read as follows:

34 450.530 A county hospital that is authorized pursuant to NRS 35 450.191 or 450.525 to purchase supplies, materials, [and] 36 equipment *and services* in accordance with this section through the purchasing contracts of the company that manages the hospital or 37 through a purchasing group may purchase the supplies, materials, 38 39 [and] equipment and services without complying with the requirements for competitive bidding set forth in [chapter] chapters 40 332 and 338 of NRS if: 41





1 1. The documents pertaining to the proposed purchase, 2 including, without limitation, the prices available to the company or 3 purchasing group, are summarized in writing and, together with a sworn statement by an officer or agent of the company or 4 5 purchasing group that the prices were obtained by the company or 6 purchasing group through a process of competitive bidding, are 7 presented to the governing body of the county hospital at its next 8 regularly scheduled meeting; [and]

2. The governing body, after reviewing the summary and
statement, finds that the proposed purchase will be made at a lower
price than the lowest price reasonably obtainable by the hospital
through competitive bidding pursuant to [chapter] chapters 332 and
338 of NRS or available to the hospital pursuant to NRS 333.470
and approves the proposed purchase [-]; and

15 3. The governing body ensures that if the services to be 16 purchased are for work on a project that qualifies as a public 17 work, as defined in NRS 338.010, the prevailing wages will be paid 18 for those services in compliance with the provisions of NRS 19 338.013 to 338.090, inclusive.

Sec. 5. NRS 450.720 is hereby amended to read as follows:

450.720 1. The board of trustees may contract with a
 company which manages hospitals for the rendering of management
 services in a district hospital.

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2. The agreement may provide:

(a) That the chief executive officer of the hospital must be anemployee of the company which manages the hospital; and

(b) That the hospital may, in accordance with the requirements
of NRS 450.730, purchase supplies, materials, [and] equipment and
services through the purchasing contracts of the company which
manages the hospital, or through a purchasing group, without
complying with the requirements for competitive bidding set forth in
[chapter] chapters 332 and 338 of NRS.

Sec. 6. NRS 450.725 is hereby amended to read as follows:

450.725 1. A district hospital may, with the approval of the board of trustees, become a member of a purchasing group for the purpose of purchasing supplies, materials, [and] equipment *and services* used by the district hospital.

2. A district hospital that becomes a member of a purchasing group may, in accordance with the requirements of NRS 450.730, purchase supplies, materials, [and] equipment *and services* through the purchasing group without complying with the requirements for competitive bidding set forth in [chapter] chapters 332 and 338 of NRS.





Sec. 7. NRS 450.730 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2 450.730 A district hospital that is authorized pursuant to NRS 3 450.720 or 450.725 to purchase supplies, materials, [and] equipment *and services* in accordance with this section through the 4 5 purchasing contracts of the company that manages the hospital or 6 through a purchasing group may purchase the supplies, materials, 7 [and] equipment and services without complying with the 8 requirements for competitive bidding set forth in [chapter] chapters 9 332 and 338 of NRS if:

10 The documents pertaining to the proposed purchase, 1. 11 including, without limitation, the prices available to the company or 12 purchasing group, are summarized in writing and, together with a 13 sworn statement by an officer or agent of the company or purchasing group that the prices were obtained by the company or 14 15 purchasing group through a process of competitive bidding, are presented to the board of trustees at its next regularly scheduled 16 17 meeting; [and]

2. The board of trustees, after reviewing the summary and
statement, finds that the proposed purchase will be made at a lower
price than the lowest price reasonably obtainable by the hospital
through competitive bidding pursuant to [chapter] chapters 332 and
338 of NRS or available to the hospital pursuant to NRS 333.470
and approves the proposed purchase [.]; and

3. The board of trustees ensures that if the services to be purchased are for work on a project that qualifies as a public work, as defined in NRS 338.010, the prevailing wages will be paid for those services in compliance with the provisions of NRS 338.013 to 338.090, inclusive.

29 Sec. 8. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.

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
