Comment: We believe that there are about 60 classrooms throughout the district that would need cameras set up. Cameras are estimated at \$120,000 with infrastructure and installation at \$600,000. Ongoing \$25,000 costs for adding to our security software.

Comment: The District cannot calculate the cost of implementing this BDR because of the following:

- 1) Where will the funding come from to pay for the installation and purchase of the camera system and servers to support them. The District does not have the available funds to purchase.
- 2) Where will the funding come from to maintain the camera system. The District may be able to maintain, but not completely positive; depends on the cost.
- 3) There will be additional cost involved in training of staff for the staff assigned to classroom and for managing the system.
- 4) The requirement for 60 days (or longer in some cases) of video and audio storage will require large amounts of storage.

Comment: Costs for implementation (Capital Cost). Based on a variety of assumptions including, but not limited to: two Special Education classrooms in every school, two cameras in every Special Education classroom, the classrooms requiring camera coverage are an average of 150 feet away from an established Equipment Room or Telecommunications Room where available, the requirement to build-out a Telecommunications Room and backbone connection to the Equipment Room for those schools where an accessible Telecommunications Room does not exist, estimated materials costs (including increased cost over time), estimated labor costs (including increased cost over time), and equipment costs for the equipment required for storage of audio and video recordings.

a. Costs assuming current timeline as identified in BDR-34-10 (requiring contractor overtime to meet the deadline): \$40 million to \$50 million over 4 years or \$12.5 million per year.

Costs for implementation (General Budget). All items listed above do not include the additional CCSD staffing, funded by General Budget, required for contract oversight (implementation) and technical support (annual maintenance and operations). This additional cost for CCSD-Police / Security Systems Department staffing and associated expenses would be approximately: \$450,000 annually.

Comment: It is estimated that to equip 425 classrooms where students with disabilities may access their education, it will cost approximately \$3000 per classroom. Each school site will also be required to upgrade its infrastructure to support video and those estimates are approximately \$20,000 per site. It is also estimated that annual repairs will be needed to the standard equipment in the amount of \$50000 and periodic server replacement at approximately \$50,000 per year. Additionally staff would need to be trained and the estimates include 1 hour of training initially at \$30 per teacher and then training for new staff as hired each year.
