AN ACT making an appropriation to the Nevada System of Higher Education for an interim study of the funding formula for the System; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State
- 2 General Fund to the Nevada System of Higher Education the sum of
- 3 \$5,000,000 for the System Administration budget account for an
- 4 interim study of the funding formula for the System.
- 5 2. The Nevada System of Higher Education shall submit a
- 6 report of the results of the study, including any recommendations for
- 7 legislation, to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for
- 8 transmission to the 83rd Session of the Nevada Legislature.
- 9 3. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by
- 10 subsection 1 must not be committed for expenditure after June 30,
- 11 2025, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity
- 12 to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise
- 13 transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated
- 14 money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after



1 September 19, 2025, by either the entity to which the money was
2 appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently
3 granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General
4 Fund on or before September 19, 2025.

5 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
