SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the sale of certain lighting products. (BDR 58-621)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to lighting products; prohibiting the sale, offer to sell or distribution of compact fluorescent lamps and linear fluorescent lamps; authorizing the [Director of the Office of Energy within the Office of the Governor to take certain actions to investigate possible violations; authorizing the Director or his or her designee to conduct certain inspections; authorizing the Director to adopt certain regulations;]
<u>Attorney General to bring a civil action against a person who has repeatedly violated such a prohibition;</u> providing a civil penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Section 7 of this bill prohibits a person, on and after January 1, [2024,] 2025, from selling, offering to sell or otherwise distributing in this State a new compact fluorescent lamp with a screw or bayonet base type. Section 3 of this bill defines "compact fluorescent lamp" to mean, in general, a compact, low-pressure electric-discharge light source containing mercury in which a fluorescent coating transforms some of the ultraviolet energy generated by the mercury discharge into visible light and which: (1) has one base of any type; (2) emits light with a certain correlated color temperature and Duv; (3) has any tube length, tube diameter, lamp size or lamp shape; and (4) is integrally ballasted or non-integrally ballasted.

Section 7 also prohibits a person, on and after January 1, [2025.] 2026, from selling, offering to sell or otherwise distributing in this State a new compact fluorescent lamp with a pin base type or a linear fluorescent lamp. Section 5 of this bill defines "linear fluorescent lamp" to mean, in general, a low-pressure electric-discharge light source containing mercury in which a fluorescent coating transforms some of the ultraviolet energy generated by the mercury discharge into visible light and which: (1) has two bases of any type; (2) emits light with a certain correlated color temperature and Duv; (3) has a tube length of not less than 0.5 feet and not more than 8.0 feet; and (4) has any tube diameter or lamp shape.

Section 8 of this bill establishes civil penalties for persons who violate the provisions of section 7. Section 6 of this bill excludes certain fluorescent lamps from the provisions of this bill.

20 [Sections 4 and] Section 9 of this bill [authorize the Director of the Office of Energy within the Office of the Governor to investigate complaints concerning alleged violations of the provisions of this bill and] authorizes the Attorney General to bring a civil action against a

23	person [for such violations. Section 9 authorizes the Director or his or her designee to enter
24	and inspect the premises of any distributor or retailer of lighting products to ensure
25	compliance with the provisions of this bill. Section 9 also authorizes the Director to adopt
26	regulations to carry out the provisions of this bill. who has repeatedly violated the
27	provisions of section 7 for injunctive relief and for the assessment and recovery of a civil
28	penalty.

6	Sec. 3. "Compact fluorescent lamp" means a compact, low-pressure
7	electric-discharge light source containing mercury in which a fluorescent coating
8	transforms some of the ultraviolet energy generated by the mercury discharge
9	into visible light and which:
10	1. Has one base of any type, including, without limitation, a screw, bayonet,
11	two-pin and four-pin base type;
12	2. Emits light with:
13	(a) A correlated color temperature of not less than 1,700 kelvins and not
14	more than 24,000 kelvins; and
15	(b) A Duv of not more than +0.024 and not less than -0.024 in the CAM02-
16	UCS standard published by the International Commission on Illumination
17	Uniform Color Space;
18	3. Has any tube length, tube diameter, lamp size and lamp shape, including,
19	without limitation, a spiral, twin tube, triple twin, 2D, PL, U-bend and circular
20	shape; and
21	4. Is integrally ballasted or non-integrally ballasted.
22	Sec. 4. ["Director" means the Director of the Office of Energy within the Office of the Covernor appointed pursuant to NRS 701.150.] (Deleted by
23	Office of the Governor appointed pursuant to NRS 701.150.] (Deleted by
24	<u>amendment.)</u>
25	Sec. 5. "Linear fluorescent lamp" means a low-pressure electric-discharge
26	light source containing mercury in which a fluorescent coating transforms some
27	of the ultraviolet energy generated by the mercury discharge into visible light and
28	which:
29	1. Has two bases, one at each end of the tube, of any type, including,
30	without limitation, a single-pin, two-pin or recessed double contact base type;
31	2. Emits light with:
32	(a) A correlated color temperature of not less than 1,700 kelvins and not
33	more than 24,000 kelvins; and
34	(b) A Duv of not more than +0.024 and not less than -0.024 in the <u>CAM02-</u>
35	UCS standard published by the International Commission on Illumination
36	Uniform Color Space : [CAM02-UCS;]
37	3. Has a tube length of not less than 0.5 feet and not more than 8.0 feet;
38	4. Has any tube diameter, including, without limitation, T5, T8, T10 and
39	T12; and
40	5. Has any lamp shape, including, without limitation, a linear, U-bend or
41	circular shape.

1	Sec. 6. The provisions of sections 2 to 9, inclusive, of this act do not apply
2	to a fluorescent lamp that:
3	1. Is designed and marketed exclusively for use in:
4	(a) Capturing or projecting an image, including, without limitation:
5	(1) Photocopying;
6	(2) Printing, either directly or in preprocessing;
7	(3) Lithography;
8	(4) Projecting film or video; or
9	(5) Holography;
10	(b) Medical or veterinary diagnosis or treatment, or in a medical device;
11	(c) Manufacturing or performing quality control of pharmaceutical
12	products;
13	(d) Conducting research projects and experiments by academic and research
14	institutions; or
15	(e) Spectroscopy and photometric applications, including, without limitation:
16	(1) Ultraviolet-visible spectroscopy;
17	(2) Molecular spectroscopy;
18	(3) Atomic absorption spectroscopy;
19	(4) Nondispersive infrared;
20	(5) Fourier transform infrared;
21	(6) Medical analysis;
22	(7) Ellipsometry;
23	(8) Laver thickness measurement;
24	(9) Process monitoring; or
25	(10) Environmental monitoring;
26	2. Emits a high proportion of ultraviolet light and:
27	(a) Has an ultraviolet power greater than two milliwatts per kilolumen; or
28	(b) Is designed and marketed exclusively for:
29	(1) Germicidal purposes, including, without limitation, the destruction of
30	DNA, and which emits a peak radiation of approximately 253.7 nanometers;
31	(2) Disinfecting or fly trapping and for which at least 5 percent of the
32	radiation power emitted at 250 nanometers or more but not more than 315
33	nanometers or at least 20 percent of the radiation power emitted at 315
34	nanometers or more but not more than 400 nanometers represents the total
35	radiation power emitted at 250 nanometers or more but not more than 800
36	nanometers;
37	(3) The generation of ozone and for which the primary purpose is to emit
38	radiation at approximately 185.1 nanometers;
39	(4) Coral zooxanthellae symbiosis and for which the radiation power
40	emitted at 400 nanometers or more but not more than 480 nanometers represents
41	at least 40 percent of the total radiation power emitted at 250 nanometers or more
42	but not more than 800 nanometers; or
43	(5) Use in a sunlamp product, as defined in 21 C.F.R. § 1040.20 [+]; or
44	3. Is a compact fluorescent lamp that is designed and marketed exclusively
45	to replace any lamp in a motor vehicle manufactured on or before January 1,
46	2020.
47	Sec. 7. 1. On and after January 1, [2024,] 2025, a person shall not sell,
48	offer to sell or otherwise distribute in this State a new compact fluorescent lamp
49	with a screw or bayonet base type.
50	2. On and after January 1, [2025,] 2026, a person shall not sell, offer to sell
51	or otherwise distribute in this State a new:
52	(a) Compact fluorescent lamp with a pin base type; or
53	(b) Linear fluorescent lamp.

1	Sec. 8. 1. A person who violates any provision of section 7 of this act
2	must, for a first violation, be issued a warning and, for any subsequent violation,
3	is liable to the State for a civil penalty of:
4	(a) For the first civil penalty assessed, not more than \$100 for each violation.
5	(b) For any subsequent assessment of a civil penalty, not more than \$500 for
6	each violation.
7	2. Each sale, offer to sell or distribution of a compact fluorescent lamp or
8	linear fluorescent lamp in violation of section 7 of this act constitutes a separate
9	violation. Each day on which such a violation occurs constitutes a separate
10	violation.
11	Sec. 9. [1. The Director or his or her designee may enter and inspect, in a
12	reasonable manner and during reasonable business hours, the premises of any
13	distributor or retailer of lighting products to determine compliance with the
14	provisions of sections 2 to 9, inclusive, of this act.
15	2. The Director may investigate complaints received concerning alleged
16	violations of the provisions of sections 2 to 9, inclusive, of this act and may report
17	to the Attorney General any alleged violation which the Director or his or her
18	designee verifies during or discovers after investigation.
19	-3 Whenever it appears that a person has repeatedly violated the provisions
20	of [sections 2 to 9, inclusive,] section 7 of this act, the Attorney General may
21	bring a civil action in any district court of this State for injunctive relief to
22	restrain the violation and for the assessment and recovery of a civil penalty.
23	[4. The Director may adopt such regulations as are necessary to carry out
24	the provisions of sections 2 to 9, inclusive, of this act.]
25	Sec. 10. This act becomes effective on January 1, [2024.] 2025.
