SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing peace officers. (BDR 23-651)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No.

AN ACT relating to peace officers; revising provisions relating to the required contents of an application for certification as a peace officer; requiring a law enforcement agency to provide to the Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission certain notice and information concerning peace officers employed by the agency; prohibiting a law enforcement agency from requiring a peace officer to make certain attestations concerning cannabis as a condition precedent to employment; prescribing requirements for certain standards adopted by regulation of the Commission; disqualifying certain persons from serving as peace officers; requiring the Executive Director of the Commission to report certain information to the National Decertification Index of the International Association of Directors of Law Enforcement Standards and Training or an equivalent database; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law sets forth provisions governing peace officers and creates the Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission, which generally provides for the training, education and certification of peace officers. (Chapter 289 of NRS) Existing law requires an application for certification as a peace officer to include the social security number of the applicant and a statement regarding the payment of child support. (NRS 289.560, 289.570) **Section 2** of this bill additionally requires an application for certification as a peace officer to include an affidavit stating that the applicant: (1) is not disqualified from serving as a peace officer; (2) has not been discharged, disciplined or asked to resign from employment with a law enforcement agency for certain conduct; and (3) has not resigned from employment or otherwise separated from employment with a law enforcement agency while an investigation concerning certain alleged conduct was pending. **Section 2** also requires the Commission to: (1) deny an application for certification that does not include the required affidavit; and (2) search the National Decertification Index of the International Association of Directors of Law Enforcement Standards and Training, or an equivalent database, to ensure that the name of the applicant does not appear in any such index or database. **Section 6** of this bill makes a conforming change to indicate the proper placement of **sections 2 and 3** of this bill in the Nevada Revised Statutes.

Section 3 requires a law enforcement agency to immediately notify the Commission if a peace officer employed by the agency: (1) is charged with certain crimes; or (2) resigns from

20 employment or otherwise separates from employment with the agency while an investigation
21 concerning alleged misconduct is pending. **Section 3** also requires a law enforcement agency
22 ~~[upon the request of the Commission,]~~ to provide certain information to the Commission
23 concerning a peace officer who resigns or otherwise separates from employment with the
24 agency while an investigation concerning alleged misconduct is pending.

25 With certain exceptions, existing law prohibits a law enforcement agency from requiring
26 a peace officer to disclose certain information as a condition precedent to a promotion, job
27 assignment or other personnel action. (NRS 289.030) **Section 5** of this bill additionally
28 prohibits a law enforcement agency from requiring a peace officer to provide an oral or
29 written attestation concerning any use of cannabis by the peace officer that occurred before
30 the peace officer submitted his or her application for employment with the law enforcement
31 agency as a condition precedent to employment as a peace officer.

32 Existing law requires the Commission to adopt regulations establishing minimum
33 standards for the certification and decertification, recruitment, selection and training of peace
34 officers. (NRS 289.510) **Section 7** of this bill provides that the standards prescribed by
35 regulations adopted by the Commission: (1) must not prohibit the certification of an applicant
36 solely on the basis that the applicant has engaged in the adult use of cannabis or the medical
37 use of cannabis; (2) must not require the decertification of a peace officer solely on the basis
38 that the peace officer has engaged in the adult use of cannabis or the medical use of cannabis;
39 and (3) must require the decertification of a peace officer upon a determination by the
40 Commission that the peace officer knowingly provided false or misleading information in his
41 or her application for certification. **Section 7** also makes conforming changes to reorganize
42 certain provisions relating to regulations adopted by the Commission. **Section 4** of this bill
43 defines certain terms for the purposes of certain requirements relating to cannabis prescribed
44 by **sections 5 and 7**.

45 Existing law provides that a person who has been convicted of a felony in this State or
46 any other state is not qualified to serve as a peace officer. (NRS 289.555) **Section 9** of this bill
47 makes this prohibition applicable regardless of whether the person has had the conviction
48 expunged or sealed. **Section 9** also provides that a person is not qualified to serve as a peace
49 officer if the person has been: (1) convicted of domestic violence in this State or any other
50 state, regardless of whether such a conviction was sealed or expunged; (2) reported to the
51 National Decertification Index or an equivalent database; or (3) decertified or has had his or
52 her certificate or license to practice or serve as a peace officer revoked or annulled by the
53 Commission or a certifying or licensing authority in any other state.

54 Existing law requires the Commission to appoint an Executive Director of the
55 Commission and authorizes the Executive Director to perform certain acts relating to the
56 certification of peace officers. (NRS 289.520, 289.530) **Section 8** of this bill requires the
57 Executive Director to report to the National Decertification Index or an equivalent database:
58 (1) the name of each decertified peace officer; and (2) any other information required by the
59 Index or database, as applicable.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 289 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the
2 provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.

3 **Sec. 2. 1. An application for certification as a peace officer must include**
4 **an affidavit stating that the applicant:**

5 **(a) Is not disqualified from serving as a peace officer pursuant to NRS**
6 **289.555;**

7 **(b) Has not been discharged, disciplined or asked to resign from employment**
8 **with a law enforcement agency in this State or any other state for conduct which**
9 **would, under the regulations adopted by the Commission pursuant to NRS**
10 **289.510, constitute grounds for denying certification or revoking the certificate of**
11 **a peace officer; and**

1 (c) *Has not resigned from employment or otherwise separated from*
 2 *employment with a law enforcement agency in this State or any other state while*
 3 *an investigation concerning allegations of conduct which would, under the*
 4 *regulations adopted by the Commission pursuant to NRS 289.510, constitute*
 5 *grounds for denying certification or revoking the certificate of a peace officer,*
 6 *was pending.*

7 2. *The Commission shall summarily deny any application for certification*
 8 *as a peace officer if the application does not include the affidavit required by*
 9 *subsection 1.*

10 3. *The Commission shall, for each applicant for certification as a peace*
 11 *officer, search the National Decertification Index of the International*
 12 *Association of Directors of Law Enforcement Standards and Training, or an*
 13 *equivalent database maintained for the purpose of serving as a national registry*
 14 *of certificate or license revocation actions relating to peace officer misconduct, to*
 15 *ensure that the name of the applicant does not appear in any such index or*
 16 *database.*

17 **Sec. 3.** *A law enforcement agency shall:*

18 1. *Immediately notify the Commission if a peace officer employed by the*
 19 *agency:*

20 (a) *Is charged with a crime for which the regulations adopted by the*
 21 *Commission pursuant to NRS 289.510 authorize the Commission to revoke or*
 22 *suspend the certificate of the peace officer; or*

23 (b) *Resigns from employment or otherwise separates from employment with*
 24 *the agency while an investigation concerning alleged misconduct is pending; and*

25 2. *If a peace officer resigns or otherwise separates from employment while*
 26 *an investigation concerning alleged misconduct is pending, provide ~~any~~*
 27 *information requested by ~~the~~ to the Commission a written summary of the outcome*
 28 *of the investigation as soon as practicable after ~~receiving~~ completing the*
 29 *~~request~~ investigation.*

30 **Sec. 4.** NRS 289.010 is hereby amended to read as follows:

31 289.010 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

32 1. "Administrative file" means any file of a peace officer containing
 33 information, comments or documents about the peace officer. The term does not
 34 include any file relating to an investigation conducted pursuant to NRS 289.057 or
 35 a criminal investigation of a peace officer.

36 2. "*Adult use of cannabis*" *has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 678A.075.*

37 3. "Law enforcement agency" means any agency, office, bureau, department,
 38 unit or division created by any statute, ordinance or rule which:

39 (a) Has a duty to enforce the law; and

40 (b) Employs any person upon whom some or all of the powers of a peace
 41 officer are conferred pursuant to NRS 289.150 to 289.360, inclusive.

42 ~~[3.]~~ 4. "*Medical use of cannabis*" *has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS*
 43 *678A.215.*

44 5. "Peace officer" means any person upon whom some or all of the powers of
 45 a peace officer are conferred pursuant to NRS 289.150 to 289.360, inclusive.

46 ~~[4.]~~ 6. "Punitive action" means any action which may lead to dismissal,
 47 demotion, suspension, reduction in salary, written reprimand or transfer of a peace
 48 officer for purposes of punishment.

49 7. "*Screening test*" *means a test of a person's blood, urine, hair or saliva to*
 50 *detect the general presence of a controlled substance or other drug.*

51 **Sec. 5.** NRS 289.030 is hereby amended to read as follows:

52 289.030 1. A law enforcement agency shall not require any peace officer to
 53 ~~[disclose]~~ :

1 (a) *Disclose* the peace officer's assets, debts, sources of income or other
2 financial information or make such a disclosure a condition precedent to a
3 promotion, job assignment or other personnel action unless that information is
4 necessary to:

5 ~~(1)~~ (1) Determine the peace officer's credentials for transfer to a specialized
6 unit;

7 ~~(2)~~ (2) Prevent any conflict of interest which may result in any new
8 assignment; or

9 ~~(3)~~ (3) Determine whether the peace officer is engaged in unlawful activity.

10 (b) *Provide an oral or written attestation concerning any use of cannabis by*
11 *the peace officer that occurred before the peace officer submitted his or her*
12 *application for employment with the law enforcement agency as a condition*
13 *precedent to employment with the agency as a peace officer.*

14 2. *Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit a law enforcement*
15 *agency from:*

16 (a) *Requiring a peace officer to provide an oral or written attestation*
17 *concerning any use of cannabis by the peace officer that has occurred after the*
18 *submission of his or her application for employment with the law enforcement*
19 *agency as a condition precedent to employment with the agency as a peace*
20 *officer; or*

21 (b) *Adopting a policy that requires a peace officer to submit to a screening*
22 *test as:*

23 (1) *A condition precedent to employment; or*

24 (2) *A condition for continued employment.*

25 3. *As used in this section, "use of cannabis" includes the adult use of*
26 *cannabis and the medical use of cannabis.*

~~(h)~~ (f) May enter into an interlocal agreement with an Indian tribe to provide training to and certification of persons employed as police officers by that Indian tribe.

~~(i)~~ (g) Shall develop and approve a standard curriculum of certified training programs in crisis intervention, which may be made available in an electronic format, and which address specialized responses to persons with mental illness and train peace officers to identify the signs and symptoms of mental illness, to de-escalate situations involving persons who appear to be experiencing a behavioral health crisis and, if appropriate, to connect such persons to treatment. A peace officer who completes any program developed pursuant to this paragraph must be issued a certificate of completion.

2. [Regulations] The Commission shall adopt regulations establishing minimum standards for:

(a) The certification and decertification, recruitment, selection and training of peace officers. The standards adopted pursuant to this paragraph must:

(1) Establish requirements for evaluations to be conducted during the recruitment and selection of peace officers, which must identify implicit bias on the part of a peace officer on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, physical or mental disability, sexual orientation or gender identity or expression;

(2) Establish requirements for basic training for category I, category II and category III peace officers and reserve peace officers;

(3) Establish standards for programs for the continuing education of peace officers, including minimum courses of study and requirements concerning attendance, which must require that all peace officers annually complete not less than 12 hours of continuing education in courses that address:

(I) Racial profiling;

(II) Mental health, including, without limitation, crisis intervention;

(III) The well-being of officers;

(IV) Implicit bias recognition;

(V) De-escalation;

(VI) Human trafficking; and

(VII) Firearms;

33 *(a) A felony in this State or any other state, regardless of whether such a
34 conviction was expunged or sealed;*

35 *(b) A battery which constitutes domestic violence pursuant to NRS 200.485,
36 regardless of whether such a conviction was expunged or sealed; or*

37 *(c) A misdemeanor crime of domestic violence, as defined in 18 U.S.C. §
38 921(a)(33), in any other state, regardless of whether such a conviction was
39 expunged or sealed.*

40 *2. Reported to the National Decertification Index of the International
41 Association of Directors of Law Enforcement and Training or an equivalent
42 database maintained for the purpose of serving as a national registry of
43 certificate or license revocation actions relating to peace officer misconduct.*

45 as a peace officer revoked or annulled by:*

48 **Sec. 10.** 1. This section becomes effective upon passage and approval.

49 2. Sections 1 to 9, inclusive, of this act become effective:

50 (a) Upon passage and approval for the purpose of adopting any regulations and
51 performing any other preparatory administrative tasks that are necessary to carry
52 out the provisions of this act; and

53 (b) On October 1, 2023, for all other purposes.
