SENATE BILL NO. 238—SENATORS STONE, KRASNER, GOICOECHEA, HANSEN, BUCK; HAMMOND, SEEVERS GANSERT AND TITUS

SUMMARY—Makes various changes relating to certain voter registration agencies. (BDR 43-583)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No.

Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in **bolded italics** is new; matter between brackets formitted material; is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to voter registration agencies; establishing certain requirements for the Department of Motor Vehicles upon receiving an application for certain licenses, cards or permits from persons who do not provide documentation of citizenship; revising provisions governing the transactions that qualify for automatic voter registration; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:** 

Existing law requires an applicant for a driver's license, driver authorization card, instruction permit, identification card or motorcycle driver's license to submit proof of his or her full legal name and age. (NRS 483.290, 483.291, 483.850, 483.860, 486.081) Existing law also establishes certain procedures for the registration of a person to vote automatically or by paper application at the Department of Motor Vehicles and other automatic voter registration agencies when a person applies for the issuance or renewal of any type of driver's license or identification card or submits certain other types of applications. (NRS 293.5727-293.57699) Sections 2, 3 and 9 of this bill provide that if a person who is 18 years of age or older submits documentation to prove his or her full legal name and age with an application for a driver's license, driver authorization card, instruction permit, identification card or motorcycle driver's license which does not demonstrate that the applicant is a citizen of the United States, the Department shall: (1) provide the applicant with a form stating that only citizens of the United States are eligible to vote; and (2) include a disclaimer on the person's driver's license, driver authorization card, instruction permit, identification card or motorcycle driver's license that only citizens of the United States are eligible to



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vote. Sections 2, 3 and 9 also require the Department to adopt regulations to carry out these requirements.

Section 11 of this bill provides that the provisions governing automatic voter registration do not apply to an application submitted to the Department for a driver authorization card. Section 11 also provides that if a person submits certain specified documentation to the Department or any other automatic voter registration agency which indicates that the person is not an elector who meets the qualifications to register to vote in this State, the automatic voter registration agency must not transmit the persons' information using the automatic voter registration system.

Existing law requires the Department to provide certain information to the holder at the time of issuance of a driver's license and identification card. (NRS 483.340, 483.840) **Sections 6 and 8** of this bill make conforming changes related to the requirement set forth in **sections 2 and 3**, respectively, that the Department also provide a form to certain persons stating that only citizens of the United States are eligible to vote.

Sections 4, 5, 7 and 10 of this bill make conforming changes to indicate the proper placement of sections 2, 3 and 9 in the Nevada Revised Statutes.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** Chapter 483 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.
- Sec. 2. 1. If a person who is 18 years of age or older submits documentation to prove his or her full legal name and age with an application for a driver's license, driver authorization card or instruction permit pursuant to NRS 483.290 or 483.291 which does not demonstrate that the applicant is a citizen of the United States:
- (a) The Department shall provide the applicant with a form that states that only citizens of the United States are eligible to vote; and
- (b) The driver's license, driver authorization card or instruction permit shall include a disclaimer on the license, card or permit, as applicable, which provides that only citizens of the United States are eligible to vote.
- 2. The Department shall adopt regulations to carry out the provisions of this section.
- Sec. 3. 1. If a person who is 18 years of age or older submits documentation to prove his or her full legal name and age with an application for an identification card pursuant to NRS 483.850 which does not indicate that the applicant is a citizen of the United States:
- (a) The Department shall provide the applicant with a form that states that only citizens of the United States are eligible to vote; and





(b) The identification card shall include a disclaimer which provides that only citizens of the United States are eligible to vote.

2. The Department shall adopt regulations to carry out the provisions of this section.

**Sec. 4.** NRS 483.015 is hereby amended to read as follows:

483.015 Except as otherwise provided in NRS 483.330, the provisions of NRS 483.010 to 483.630, inclusive, *and section 2 of this act*, apply only with respect to noncommercial drivers' licenses.

**Sec. 5.** NRS 483.020 is hereby amended to read as follows:

483.020 As used in NRS 483.010 to 483.630, inclusive, *and section 2 of this act*, unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in NRS 483.030 to 483.190, inclusive, have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.

**Sec. 6.** NRS 483.340 is hereby amended to read as follows:

483.340 1. The Department shall, upon payment of the required fee, issue to every qualified applicant a driver's license indicating the type or class of vehicles the licensee may drive.

- 2. The Department shall adopt regulations prescribing the information that must be contained on a driver's license.
- The Department may issue a driver's license for purposes of identification only for use by officers of local police and sheriffs' departments, agents of the Investigation Division of the Department of Public Safety while engaged in special undercover investigations relating to narcotics or prostitution or for other undercover investigations requiring the establishment of a fictitious identity, federal agents while engaged in undercover investigations, investigators employed by the Attorney General while engaged in undercover investigations, criminal investigators employed by the Secretary of State while engaged in undercover investigations and agents of the Nevada Gaming Control Board while engaged in investigations pursuant to NRS 463.140. An application for such a license must be made through the head of the police or sheriff's department, the Chief of the Investigation Division of the Department of Public Safety, the director of the appropriate federal agency, the Attorney General, the Secretary of State or his or her designee or the Chair of the Nevada Gaming Control Board. Such a license is exempt from the fees required by NRS 483.410. The Department, by regulation, shall provide for the cancellation of any such driver's license upon the completion of the special investigation for which it was issued.
- 4. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 239.0115, information pertaining to the issuance of a driver's license pursuant to subsection 3 is confidential.



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- 5. It is a misdemeanor for any person to use a driver's license issued pursuant to subsection 3 for any purpose other than the special investigation for which it was issued.
- 6. At the time of the issuance of the driver's license, the Department shall:
- (a) Give the holder the opportunity to have indicated on his or her driver's license that the holder:
- (1) Wishes to be a donor of all or part of his or her body pursuant to NRS 451.500 to 451.598, inclusive; or
- (2) Does not at that time wish to make an anatomical gift of his or her body or part thereof.
- (b) Give the holder the opportunity to have indicated whether he or she wishes to donate \$1 or more to the Anatomical Gift Account created by NRS 460.150.
- (c) Provide to each holder who is interested in becoming a donor information relating to anatomical gifts, including the procedure for registering as a donor with the donor registry with which the Department has entered into a contract pursuant to this paragraph. To carry out this paragraph, the Department shall, on such terms as it deems appropriate, enter into a contract with a donor registry that is in compliance with the provisions of NRS 451.500 to 451.598, inclusive.
- (d) If the Department has established a program for imprinting a symbol or other indicator of a medical condition on a driver's license pursuant to NRS 483.3485, give the holder the opportunity to have a symbol or other indicator of a medical condition imprinted on his or her driver's license.
- (e) Provide to the holder information instructing the holder how to register with the Next-of-Kin Registry pursuant to NRS 483.653 if he or she so chooses.
- (f) Provide the holder the information required pursuant to section 2 of this act, if applicable.
- 7. At the time of the renewal of the driver's license, the Department shall:
- (a) If the holder indicated at the time of the issuance of the driver's license pursuant to subsection 6 that the holder wishes to be a donor of all or part of his or her body pursuant to NRS 451.500 to 451.598, inclusive, provide the holder:
- (1) Notice that, unless the holder affirmatively indicates upon the renewal of the driver's license that he or she wishes to change that indication, the indication will remain on his or her driver's license:
- (2) The opportunity to have indicated whether he or she wishes to donate \$1 or more to the Anatomical Gift Account created by NRS 460.150; and





- (3) If the Department has established a program for imprinting a symbol or other indicator of a medical condition on a driver's license pursuant to NRS 483.3485, the opportunity to have a symbol or other indicator of a medical condition imprinted on his or her driver's license.
- (b) If the holder indicated at the time of the issuance of the driver's license pursuant to subsection 6 that the holder did not at that time wish to be a donor of all or part of his or her body pursuant to NRS 451.500 to 451.598, inclusive, provide the holder:
- (1) The opportunity to change that indication to indicate that the holder wishes to be a donor of all or part of his or her body pursuant to NRS 451.500 to 451.598, inclusive;
- (2) The opportunity to have indicated whether he or she wishes to donate \$1 or more to the Anatomical Gift Account created by NRS 460.150;
- (3) If the holder is interested in becoming a donor, information relating to anatomical gifts, including the procedure for registering as a donor with the donor registry with which the Department has entered into a contract pursuant to this section; and
- (4) If the Department has established a program for imprinting a symbol or other indicator of a medical condition on a driver's license pursuant to NRS 483.3485, the opportunity to have a symbol or other indicator of a medical condition imprinted on his or her driver's license.
- (c) Provide the holder the information required pursuant to section 2 of this act, if applicable.
- 8. If the holder wishes to make a donation to the Anatomical Gift Account, the Department shall collect the donation and deposit the money collected in the State Treasury for credit to the Anatomical Gift Account.
- 9. The Department shall submit to the donor registry with which the Department has entered into a contract pursuant to paragraph (c) of subsection 6 information from the records of the Department relating to persons who have drivers' licenses that indicate the intention of those persons to make an anatomical gift. The Department shall adopt regulations to carry out the provisions of this subsection.
  - **Sec. 7.** NRS 483.820 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 483.820 1. A person who applies for an identification card in accordance with the provisions of NRS 483.810 to 483.890, inclusive, *and section 3 of this act* and who is not ineligible to receive an identification card pursuant to NRS 483.861, is entitled to receive an identification card if the person is:





(a) A resident of this State and is 10 years of age or older and does not hold a valid driver's license or identification card from any state or jurisdiction; or (b) A seasonal resident who does not hold a valid Nevada driver's license. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 483.825, Department shall charge and collect the following fees for the issuance of an original, duplicate or changed identification card: An original or duplicate identification card issued to a person 65 years of age or older which expires on or before the fourth anniversary of the person's birthday ......\$4 An original or duplicate identification card issued to a person 65 years of age or older which expires on or before the eighth An original or duplicate identification card issued to a person under 18 years of age which expires on the eighth anniversary of the person's birthday ...... 6 A renewal of an identification card for a person under 18 years of age which expires on the eighth anniversary of the person's birthday ...... 6 An original or duplicate identification card issued to a person under 18 years of age which expires on or before the fourth A renewal of an identification card for a person under 18 years of age which expires on or

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3. The Department shall not charge a fee for:

- (a) An identification card issued to a person who has voluntarily surrendered his or her driver's license pursuant to NRS 483.420; or
- (b) A renewal of an identification card for a person 65 years of age or older.
- 4. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 483.825, the increase in fees authorized in NRS 483.347 must be paid in addition to the fees charged pursuant to this section.
- 5. As used in this section, "photograph" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 483.125.
  - **Sec. 8.** NRS 483.840 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 483.840 1. The form of the identification cards must be similar to that of drivers' licenses but distinguishable in color or otherwise.
- 2. Identification cards do not authorize the operation of any motor vehicles.
- 3. The Department shall adopt regulations prescribing the information that must be contained on an identification card.
- 4. At the time of the issuance of the identification card, the Department shall:
- (a) Give the holder the opportunity to have indicated on his or her identification card that the holder:
- (1) Wishes to be a donor of all or part of his or her body pursuant to NRS 451.500 to 451.598, inclusive; or
- (2) Does not at that time wish to make an anatomical gift of his or her body or part thereof.
- (b) Give the holder the opportunity to indicate whether he or she wishes to donate \$1 or more to the Anatomical Gift Account created by NRS 460.150.
- (c) Provide to each holder who is interested in becoming a donor information relating to anatomical gifts, including the procedure for registering as a donor with the donor registry with which the Department has entered into a contract pursuant to this paragraph.





To carry out this paragraph, the Department shall, on such terms as it deems appropriate, enter into a contract with a donor registry that is in compliance with the provisions of NRS 451.500 to 451.598, inclusive.

- (d) If the Department has established a program for imprinting a symbol or other indicator of a medical condition on an identification card pursuant to NRS 483.863, give the holder the opportunity to have a symbol or other indicator of a medical condition imprinted on his or her identification card.
- (e) Provide to the holder information instructing the holder how to register with the Next-of-Kin Registry pursuant to NRS 483.653 if he or she so chooses.
- (f) Provide the holder the information required pursuant to section 3 of this act, if applicable.
- 5. At the time of the renewal of the identification card, the Department shall:
- (a) If the holder indicated at the time of the issuance of the identification card pursuant to subsection 4 that the holder wishes to be a donor of all or part of his or her body pursuant to NRS 451.500 to 451.598, inclusive, provide the holder:
- (1) Notice that, unless the holder affirmatively indicates upon the renewal of the identification card that he or she wishes to change that indication, the indication will remain on his or her identification card;
- (2) The opportunity to have indicated whether he or she wishes to donate \$1 or more to the Anatomical Gift Account created by NRS 460.150; and
- (3) If the Department has established a program for imprinting a symbol or other indicator of a medical condition on an identification card pursuant to NRS 483.3485, the opportunity to have a symbol or other indicator of a medical condition imprinted on his or her identification card.
- (b) If the holder indicated at the time of the issuance of the identification card pursuant to subsection 4 that the holder did not at that time wish to be a donor of all or part of his or her body pursuant to NRS 451.500 to 451.598, inclusive, provide the holder:
- (1) The opportunity to change that indication to indicate that the holder wishes to be a donor of all or part of his or her body pursuant to NRS 451.500 to 451.598, inclusive;
- (2) The opportunity to have indicated whether he or she wishes to donate \$1 or more to the Anatomical Gift Account created by NRS 460.150;
- (3) If the holder is interested in becoming a donor, information relating to anatomical gifts, including the procedure for





registering as a donor with the donor registry with which the Department has entered into a contract pursuant to this section; and

- (4) If the Department has established a program for imprinting a symbol or other indicator of a medical condition on an identification card pursuant to NRS 483.3485, the opportunity to have a symbol or other indicator of a medical condition imprinted on his or her identification card.
- (c) Provide to the holder information instructing the holder how to register with the Next-of-Kin Registry pursuant to NRS 483.653 if he or she chooses.
- (d) Provide the holder the information required pursuant to section 3 of this act, if applicable.
- 6. If the holder wishes to make a donation to the Anatomical Gift Account, the Department shall collect the donation and deposit the money collected in the State Treasury for credit to the Anatomical Gift Account.
- 7. The Department shall submit to the donor registry with which the Department has entered into a contract pursuant to paragraph (c) of subsection 4 information from the records of the Department relating to persons who have identification cards issued by the Department that indicate the intention of those persons to make an anatomical gift. The Department shall adopt regulations to carry out the provisions of this subsection.
- **Šec. 9.** Chapter 486 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
- 1. If a person who is 18 years of age or older submits documentation to prove his or her full legal name and age with an application for a motorcycle driver's license pursuant to NRS 486.081 which does not demonstrate that the applicant is a citizen of the United States:
- (a) The Department shall provide the applicant with a form that states that only citizens of the United States are eligible to vote; and
- (b) The motorcycle driver's license shall include a disclaimer on the license which provides that only citizens of the United States are eligible to vote.
- 2. The Department shall adopt regulations to carry out the provisions of this section.
  - **Sec. 10.** NRS 486.011 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 486.011 As used in NRS 486.011 to 486.381, inclusive, *and* section 9 of this act, unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in NRS 486.031 to 486.057, inclusive, have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.





- **Sec. 11.** NRS 293.5768 is hereby amended to read as follows: 293.5768 1. The following agencies are automatic voter registration agencies:
  - (a) The Department of Motor Vehicles;

- (b) The Department of Health and Human Services;
- (c) Any agency designated by the Director of the Department of Health and Human Services to receive applications for Medicaid;
- (d) The Silver State Health Insurance Exchange created by NRS 6951.200:
- (e) Any agency that has been designated by the Governor as an automatic voter registration agency pursuant to NRS 293.57682; and
- (f) Any agency of an Indian tribe that has been designated by the Governor to be an automatic voter registration agency pursuant to NRS 293.57684.
- 2. If, in the normal course of business, an automatic voter registration agency collects sufficient information that demonstrates a person is qualified to vote pursuant to NRS 293.485, including, without limitation, proof of identity, citizenship, residence and date of birth, the provisions of NRS 293.5768 to 293.57699, inclusive, apply to the automatic voter registration agency when a person submits any of the following:
- (a) An application for the issuance or renewal of or change of address for any type of driver's license or identification card issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles [;], other than a driver authorization card issued pursuant to NRS 483.291;
- (b) An application for Medicaid through the system established by the Department of Health and Human Services pursuant to NRS 422.2703;
- (c) An application for health insurance through the Silver State Health Insurance Exchange; and
- (d) An application for any service or assistance from an automatic voter registration agency described in paragraph (e) or (f) of subsection 1.
  - 3. An automatic voter registration agency shall not:
- (a) Request any additional information for purposes of voter registration that is not required in the normal course of business; and
- (b) Transmit any information about a person using the system established pursuant to NRS 293.57686 if the person [did]:
- (1) Did not provide the agency in the normal course of business sufficient information that demonstrates the person is qualified to vote pursuant to NRS 293.485, including, without limitation, proof of identity, citizenship, residence and date of birth [.]; or





(2) Submits any of the following documents with an application described in subsection 2 to an automatic voter registration agency:

(I) A Permanent Resident Card, Alien Registration Receipt Card, Form I-551, or any temporary version of such documents issued by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services of the Department of Homeland Security;

(II) An employment authorization document issued by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services of the Department of Homeland Security using Form I-765 or I-766;

(III) An arrival and departure record issued by United States Customs and Border Protection of the Department of Homeland Security using Form I-94;

(IV) A nonimmigrant visa issued by the United States

Department of State; or

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(V) Any birth certificate, driver's license or identification card which indicates that the person is not 17 years of age or older as of the date of the application.

**Sec. 12.** 1. This section becomes effective upon passage and approval.

2. Sections 1 to 11, inclusive, of this act become effective:

- (a) Upon passage and approval for the purpose of adopting regulations and any other preparatory administrative tasks that are necessary to carry out the provisions of this act; and
  - (b) On January 1, 2024, for all other purposes.
