The agency has reviewed this bill and has determined that the fiscal impact to the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine (the Board) cannot be determined at this time. Sections 6, 28, 29, 45, and 63 of this bill would require the Board to maintain, transmit, and exchange health information electronically in accordance with the standards for networks and technologies to be used to maintain, transmit, and exchange health information as set forth in the framework prescribed by regulations from the Director of Health and Human Services (the Department) as provided in Section 6 of this bill. As those regulations have not yet been issued, the costs associated with compliance cannot presently be determined. Additionally, sections 9, 17, 45, 47, 50, and 53 of this bill would also require the Board to immediately suspend a credential issued to a health care provider regulated by the Board upon receiving notice from the Department that such health care provider has failed to comply with the requirements of this bill and sections 1, 9, 17, 45, 47, 50, and 53 of this bill prescribe a similar process to reinstate a suspended credential. The costs to comply with the suspension and reinstatement process are unable to be determined at this time as costs related to possible changes to the Board's licensing system as well as to the Board's disciplinary process as a result of these bill requirements are unknown at this time.
