SB412 / BDR 14-1091 is an act relating to criminal justice; prohibiting certain acts involving the use, possession or carrying a firearm...; revising the elements of and penalties for certain burglary; increasing the penalty for a person...fentanyl...; revising provisions... trafficking...; increasing the minimum and maximum terms...drives under the influence...; providing penalties and other matters properly relating thereto.

Sections 15 to 18, 20 to 36, 40, 45, 48, 53 to 57 provide for reduced or increased thresholds for burglary, theft, firearms, and drug related crimes. If this bill as introduced is enacted, it would require the Department of Public Safety, Records, Communications and Compliance Division (RCCD), Nevada Offense Code (NOC) Unit staff to modify 14 NOCs, repeal 99 NOCs, create 117 NOCs and 117 subtypes. However, the cumulative impact of the legislation from the 2023 session will increase the volume of NOC revisions. The RCCD may request to return to the Interim Finance Committee in the 2023-2025 biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
