SB389 / BDR 15-133 is an act relating to crimes; revising provisions governing crimes relating to facilitating sex trafficking; requiring certain entities to work collaboratively to prepare and submit a comprehensive biennial report; revising certain requirements for compensation from the Fund for the Compensation of Victims of Crime; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Sections 1-3 provide that a person who commits the crime of facilitating sex trafficking is subject to the same penalties if the crime was committed against a peace officer posing as a child, or other person posing as a child assisting police in an investigation.

If this bill as introduced is enacted, it would require the Department of Public Safety, Records, Communications and Compliance Division (RCCD), Nevada Offense Code (NOC) Unit staff to repeal 4 NOCs, create 4 NOCs and 4 subtypes. However, the cumulative impact of the legislation from the 2023 session will increase the volume of NOC revisions. The RCCD may request to return to the Interim Finance Committee in the 2023-2025 biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
