SB35 BDR40-423 AN ACT relating to controlled substances; establishes the crimes of low-level trafficking in fentanyl, mid-level trafficking in fentanyl and high-level trafficking in fentanyl; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Section 1 of this bill establishes the crimes of low-level trafficking in fentanyl, mid-level trafficking in fentanyl and high-level trafficking in fentanyl.

If this bill as introduced is enacted, it would require the Department of Public Safety, Records Communications and Compliance Division (RCCD), Nevada Offense Code Unit (NOC) staff to create 7 new NOCs and 7 new subtypes. However, the cumulative impact of the legislation from the 2023 session will increase the volume of NOC revisions. The RCCD may request to return to the Interim Finance Committee in the 2023-2025 biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
