Comment: Section 7 would require updates to HAVA affirmation and poll pad workflow to include the provisional ballot process for residency challenges. It is estimated these changes would result in a one-time cost to the Clark County Election Department of \$100,000 for IT development. Section 14 would require a recount if the difference between the number of votes for the top two candidates is 0.25 percent or less, or if the difference between the results of a ballot question is 0.25 percent or less. It is estimated the recount process would cost \$150,000 per election. This amount includes approximately \$20,000 for materials, \$50,000 for part-time staff, \$40,000 for vendor support, and \$40,000 for security.
