BDR 34-549 / SB80 is an act relating to public safety; revising the contents of certain policies adopted by the Nevada Interscholastic Activities Association and organizations for youth sports concerning the prevention and treatment of injuries to the head; requiring certain schools to adopt such a policy; requiring certain schools to create and distribute a brochure concerning the prevention and treatment of injuries to the head and establish a concussion management team; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Section 9 provides that a person who willfully fails to perform the duties prescribed by concussion protocol is guilty of a misdemeanor.

If this bill is enacted as introduced, it would require the Department of Public Safety, Records Communications and Compliance Division (RCCD), Nevada Offense Code Unit (NOC) staff to create 1 new NOC and 1 new subtype. However, the cumulative impact of the legislation from the 2023 session will increase the volume of NOC revisions. The RCCD may request to return to the Interim Finance Committee in the 2023-2025 biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
