# City/County: City of Reno

Comment: Permitting vendors to operate in city parks would put an additional burden on the maintenance of those parks as waste from food and goods being sold in or near park facilities would be discarded in the near vicinity of the vendor in a park trash receptacle. The additional staff time to service trash containers and cost of additional disposal would require 50 additional hours of staff time per week as well as \$24,000 in increased costs annually for disposal.

Comment: The bill would prohibit Clark County from enforcing a complete prohibition on sidewalk vendors. The bill would have a negative impact on Clark County, though the amount cannot be determined. Additional staffing and resources would be needed due to increased licensing, permitting, enforcement, and sidewalk maintenance that would be required as a result of this bill. However, since it is difficult to determine how many sidewalk vendors there will be and where they will be located, the fiscal impact is indeterminable.
