SB171 / BDR 15-649 is an act relating to crimes; prohibiting the purchase, possession, or ownership of a firearm by a person who has been convicted of committing or attempting to commit a crime motivated by certain characteristics of the victim; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Section 1 amends statute to add the term "purchase"; a prohibited person shall not purchase, own, or have in his or her possession or under his or her custody or control any firearm. Section 1 also prohibits a person from purchasing, owning, or having in his or her possession or under his or her custody or control any firearm if the person has been convicted of committing or attempting to commit certain offenses involving violence that are motivated by certain characteristics of the victim (hate crime).

If this bill as introduced is enacted, it would require the Department of Public Safety, Records Communications and Compliance Division (RCCD), Nevada Offense Code Unit (NOC) staff to modify 11 NOCs. However, the cumulative impact of the legislation from the 2023 session will increase the volume of NOC revisions. The RCCD may request to return to the Interim Finance Committee in the 2023-2025 biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
