After reviewing the requirements of the proposed legislation, the Nevada System of Higher Education is unable to determine the full fiscal impact. NSHE does, however, anticipate that there would be an ongoing loss of tuition and fee revenues across the System, and an additional personnel expense associated with the appointment of the Liaison for Post-Secondary Education for Homeless Pupils by the Governor to work within NSHE to serve the target population, if the proposed legislation were to be implemented. While NSHE is unable to anticipate the number of homeless and unaccompanied youth who would take advantage of the fee waiver, the table in the attached Exhibit shows the approximate minimum cost per academic year per full-time student who is not receiving federal education benefits, based on NSHE's 2022-23 registration fee rates. Therefore, the full fiscal impact of the proposed legislation would depend on how many homeless and unaccompanied youth would take advantage of the benefit, what institution those youth chose to attend, and the student type.
