The agency has reviewed the bill as written and determined there is a fiscal impact to the Department of Administration, Purchasing Division. To implement SB 185 (BDR 18-35), Purchasing anticipates hiring a Management Analyst III and an Administrative Assistant II. The Management Analyst III would serve as the Director of the Business Opportunity Outreach Unit (a position created by Section 3(2) of the bill). Travel of \$9,986 per year is requested to meet with companies throughout the state to foster outreach and provide training and assistance in obtaining government contracts as required by Section 3 of the bill. The Administrative Assistant II position would provide administrative support and help with the collecting of data from local governments.

Section 3(3)(e) would require Purchasing to establish a centralized database of minority-owned businesses, womenowned businesses, businesses owned by persons with disabilities, local emerging small businesses and microbusinesses which can be shared with state and local governmental agencies. This can be accomplished with changes to Purchasing's existing NevadaEPro system at a de minimus cost.

Section 3(3)(c) would require Purchasing to develop and implement an online data dashboard that provides statistics to be presented in reports required by the bill. Purchasing would need to build such a system into its website. Purchasing estimates approximately 60 development hours would be needed for the dashboard and website changes at a cost of \$150 per hour, or \$9,000 in total.
