The Board has evaluated BDR 54-814 and is uncertain if there will be a fiscal impact. Seven (7) states must join the compact before the Commission will be seated and begin defining rules which may include costs.

At this time, the database for the compact will be housed by the Federation of State Massage Therapy Boards. The Nevada Board of Massage Therapy is already a participant in the Federation and pays a fee assessment for that membership which at this time is not set to be increased.

There is a possibility that there may be some impact to revenue depending on which states join IMpact and if there are licensees that would then no longer maintain a Nevada license by choosing a multi-state license in their home state. At this time only 203 of the over 5,000 Nevada licensees reside in other states that might choose to participate in the multi-state licensing compact. If all chose to do so, the biennial impact would be a reduction in revenue of \$59,885; however, it is impossible to say if any would or would not qualify/choose to obtain a multi-state license from another jurisdiction or if the other states they may be licensed in would be part of the compact.
