SB233 / BDR 32-87 is an act relating to taxation; providing for the imposition, administration, collection and enforcement of a tax on the rental of certain heavy equipment; excluding certain heavy equipment from the tax on personal property; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Sections 30 and 31 of this bill establish that a person who submits a false or fraudulent return or falsifies entries in books, records or accounts with intent to evade the tax is guilty of a gross misdemeanor, and that a person who violates any other provision governing the tax created by this bill is guilty of a misdemeanor.

If this bill as introduced is enacted, it would require the Department of Public Safety, Records Communications and Compliance Division (RCCD), Nevada Offense Code Unit (NOC) staff to create 3 new NOCs and 3 new subtypes. However, the cumulative impact of the legislation from the 2023 session will increase the volume of NOC revisions. The RCCD may request to return to the Interim Finance Committee in the 2023-2025 biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
