SB269 / BDR 50-246 is an act relating to cruelty to animals; prohibiting a person from restraining a dog during any time in which a heat advisory has been issued for the area; eliminating from provisions relating to animal cruelty certain exemptions that authorize a dog to be restrained in a certain manner or maintained in certain enclosures; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Section 1 of this bill prohibits a person from restraining a dog during any time in which a heat advisory has been issued for the area by the National Weather Service.

If this bill as introduced is enacted, it would require the Department of Public Safety, Records Communications and Compliance Division (RCCD), Nevada Offense Code Unit (NOC) staff to modify 3 NOCs. However, the cumulative impact of the legislation from the 2023 session will increase the volume of NOC revisions. The RCCD may request to return to the Interim Finance Committee in the 2023-2025 biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
