Senate Bill 260, Bill Draft Request 40-675, exempts senior living community referral agencies from being licensed if satisfying certain requirements. The Division of Public and Behavioral Health currently licenses three referral agencies that may meet the definition of a senior living community referral agency in SB260. If the current referral agencies meet the definition of a senior living community referral agency and meet the unlicensed criteria, then those agencies may choose not to be licensed. This would result in a revenue loss of \$4,062 per year. Health Care Quality and Compliance (HCQC) can absorb the possible loss of revenue, which can be offset with savings in labor distribution.
