SB310 / BDR 54-601 is an act relating to dentistry; providing for the licensure and regulation of expanded function dental assistants; authorizing a dental hygienist who possesses certain qualifications to prescribe and dispense certain drugs; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Sections 4-8 provide for the licensure and regulations of expanded function dental assistants. Section 16 provides authorization for fingerprints to be submitted to the Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History for submission to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for its report.

If this bill is enacted as introduced, the proposed bill may impact RCCD with an unknown increase in workload to the Fingerprint Support Unit and the Fingerprint Examiner Unit. RCCD may request to return to the Interim Finance Committee in the 2023-2025 biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing. The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) will need to review and approve the language of the bill to determine whether or not it meets the criteria pursuant to Public Law 92-544 as a condition of releasing its criminal history records. RCCD will coordinate the review by the FBI. If the language does not meet the criteria, RCCD will advise and coordinate with the sponsor and/or respective agency to amend the bill to include the appropriate language.
