Senate Bill 354 (1st Reprint): Revises provisions relating to justices of the peace. (BDR 1-809)

Haley Proehl, Committee Policy Analyst:

<u>Senate Bill 354 (1st Reprint)</u> was heard in Committee on May 9, 2023 [<u>Exhibit C</u>]. The measure requires that in addition to any other requirement under law or court rule, a justice of the peace who is not licensed or admitted to practice law in the courts of the State must, within 18 months of taking the oath of office, pass an exam prescribed by the Nevada Supreme Court. The exam must cover topics related to the duties of a justice of the peace. The provisions of the bill do not apply to a justice of the peace who holds office on July 1, 2023. There are no amendments.
