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BDR 18-775—Revises provisions governing economic development. (Later introduced as Assembly Bill 428.)

Michael Nakamoto, Chief Principal Deputy Fiscal Analyst:

The first bill draft request is 18-775, which is an economic development bill. It requires the Office of Economic Development to establish and administer a Career Pathways Demonstration Program, and has various provisions relating to that, including the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada and GOED [Office of Economic Development, Office of the Governor].
