Program for Women, Infants and Children to cover the purchase of menstrual products. (BDR R-980)

SENATOR MELANIE SCHEIBLE (Senatorial District No. 9):

I am pleased to present <u>S.J.R. 5</u> which is simple. I presented <u>Senate Bill</u> (S.B.) 161 in the Senate Health and Human Services Committee, a bill which allows Nevadans who receive Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Women, Infants and Children (WIC) funding to utilize those benefits for purchasing menstrual products. They are currently not allowed to do so.

SENATE BILL 161: Provides for the use of certain federal benefits to purchase menstrual products. (BDR 38-811)

The challenging part is at the federal level where SNAP and WIC do not allow the use of those funds for products other than food. Senate Joint Resolution 5 is the companion piece to S.B. 161 which says Nevada is going to ask Congress to change this at the federal level.

I hope this is the start of a longer project for me personally working to advocate for this change at the federal level.

BRYAN WACHTER (Retail Association of Nevada):

The Retail Association of Nevada looks forward to the journey Senator Scheible is on.
