AN ACT relating to civil immunity; providing immunity from civil liability to licensed firearm

dealers under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating

thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law provides immunity from civil liability to certain persons for acts or omissions

under certain circumstances. (Chapter 41 of NRS) This bill extends immunity from civil liability

to a licensed firearm dealer who returns a firearm to the owner of the firearm pursuant to a firearm

hold agreement wherein the licensed firearm dealer: (1) takes physical possession of the owner's

lawfully possessed firearm at the request of the owner; (2) holds the firearm for an agreed period;

and (3) returns the firearm to the owner according to the terms of the agreement.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 41 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, a licensed firearm dealer is immune from civil liability for any act or omission arising from a firearm hold agreement and resulting in personal injury or death, including the return of any firearm to the firearm owner by a licensed firearm dealer at the termination of a firearm hold agreement.
- 2. A licensed firearm dealer is not immune from civil liability pursuant to subsection 1 if any action arising from a firearm hold agreement was the result of otherwise unlawful conduct on the part of the licensed firearm dealer.
 - 3. As used in this section:
- (a) "Firearm hold agreement" means a written or oral agreement between an owner of a firearm and a licensed firearm dealer in which a licensed firearm dealer:
- (1) Takes physical possession of the owner's lawfully possessed firearm at the request of the owner;
 - (2) Holds the firearm for an agreed period; and
 - (3) Returns the firearm to the owner according to the terms of the agreement.
 - (b) "Licensed firearm dealer" means a person licensed pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 923(a).





Sec. 2. The amendatory provisions of this act apply to a cause of action that accrues on or after October 1, 2025.
