SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing bidding procedures for a homeowners' association. (BDR 10-818)

AN ACT relating to common-interest communities; revising provisions relating to the solicitation of bids for a homeowners' association project; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires a homeowners' association to solicit, whenever reasonably possible, at least three bids if the association project is expected to cost: (1) in a common-interest community that consists of less than 1,000 units, 3 percent or more of the annual budget of the association; or (2) in a common-interest community that consists of 1,000 or more units, 1 percent or more of the annual budget of the association. (NRS 116.31086) This bill requires an association to similarly solicit bids, unless any undue delay in the commencement of the association project could exacerbate property damage or pose a risk of injury. This bill also requires an association to award the contract for an association project to the lowest responsive bidder.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 116.31086 is hereby amended to read as follows:

116.31086 1. [If an association solicits bids for an association project:

(a) The Except as provided in subsection 2, an association [must, whenever reasonably possible,] shall solicit at least three bids if [the] an association project is expected to cost:



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[(1)] (a) In a common-interest community that consists of less than 1,000 units, 3 percent or more of the annual budget of the association; or

[(2)] (b) In a common-interest community that consists of 1,000 or more units, 1 percent or more of the annual budget of the association. [; and

(b)] 2. An association is not required to solicit bids for an association project described in subsection 1 if any undue delay in the commencement of the association project could exacerbate property damage or pose a risk of injury.

3. The bids must be opened and read aloud during a meeting of the executive board.

[2.] 4. An association shall award the contract for an association project to the lowest responsive bidder.

5. As used in this section, "association project" includes, without limitation, a project that involves the maintenance, repair, replacement or restoration of any part of the common elements or which involves the provision of professional services to the association, including, without limitation, accounting, engineering and legal services.
