SUMMARY—Enacts provisions strengthening certain protections for certain activities under the First Amendment. (BDR 19-136)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to governmental administration; requiring, with certain exceptions, a governmental entity to keep confidential certain personal information regarding donors, members or volunteers of a nonprofit organization; prohibiting, with certain exceptions, a governmental entity from requesting or releasing certain personal information regarding donors, members or volunteers of a nonprofit organization; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law authorizes certain governmental agencies to collect certain personal information. (Chapter 239B of NRS) Existing law also prohibits, with 234567 certain exceptions, a governmental agency from requiring a person to include certain personal information on any document submitted to the governmental agency after a certain date. (NRS 239B.030) Section 2 of this bill requires, with certain exceptions, a governmental entity to keep confidential any personal information in the records of the governmental entity that identifies a person as a 8 donor, member or volunteer of a nonprofit organization. Section 2 also prohibits, 9 with certain exceptions, a governmental entity from: (1) requiring that any person 10 or nonprofit organization provide the governmental entity with personal 11 information that identifies a person as a donor, member or volunteer of a nonprofit 12 organization; (2) releasing, publicizing or otherwise publicly disclosing personal 13 information that identifies a person as a donor, member or volunteer of a nonprofit 14 organization; or (3) requesting or requiring a current or prospective contractor or 15 grantee to provide a list of nonprofit organizations to which the contractor or 16 grantee has provided support. Section 2 provides that the personal information that 17 identifies a person as a donor, member or volunteer of a nonprofit organization 18 includes any list, record, register, roster or other data of any kind that includes a





19 donation, name, address or telephone number that directly or indirectly identifies a 20 person as a donor of financial or nonfinancial support, member or volunteer of any nonprofit organization.

21 22 23 24 25 Section 2 provides that a person who alleges that the person has been harmed by a governmental entity or an officer or employee of a governmental entity that has violated these provisions may bring a civil action to obtain certain relief.

Section 1 of this bill provides that such personal information is not a public record.

26 27 28 29 Section 3 of this bill prohibits the Secretary of State, when carrying out certain requirements of existing law, from collecting or disclosing any information that directly identifies a person as a donor of financial support to a nonprofit 30 organization.

31 Section 4 of this bill provides that any information collected by the Attorney 32 33 General in an audit, examination, review or investigation of a corporation for public benefit or a corporation holding assets in charitable trust may only be used in 34 connection with the audit, examination, review or investigation and is otherwise 35 subject to the requirements of section 2.

Any 28 such copies, abstracts or memoranda may be used to supply the 29 general public with copies, abstracts or memoranda of the records or 30 may be used in any other way to the advantage of the governmental entity or of the general public. This section does not supersede or in 31 32 any manner affect the federal laws governing copyrights or enlarge, 33 diminish or affect in any other manner the rights of a person in any written book or record which is copyrighted pursuant to federal law. 34

2. A governmental entity may not reject a book or record which is copyrighted solely because it is copyrighted.

37 3. A governmental entity that has legal custody or control of a 38 public book or record shall not deny a request made pursuant to 39 subsection 1 to inspect or copy or receive a copy of a public book or 40 record on the basis that the requested public book or record contains information that is confidential if the governmental entity can 41 42 redact, delete, conceal or separate, including, without limitation, 43 electronically, the confidential information from the information 44 included in the public book or record that is not otherwise 45 confidential.





4. If requested, a governmental entity shall provide a copy of a
public record in an electronic format by means of an electronic
medium. Nothing in this subsection requires a governmental entity
to provide a copy of a public record in an electronic format or by
means of an electronic medium if:

(1) Was not created or prepared in an electronic format; and

(2) Is not available in an electronic format; or

9 (b) Providing the public record in an electronic format or by 10 means of an electronic medium would:

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(1) Give access to proprietary software; or

12 (2) Require the production of information that is confidential 13 and that cannot be redacted, deleted, concealed or separated from 14 information that is not otherwise confidential.

15 5. An officer, employee or agent of a governmental entity who 16 has legal custody or control of a public record:

(a) Shall not refuse to provide a copy of that public record in the
medium that is requested because the officer, employee or agent has
already prepared or would prefer to provide the copy in a different
medium.

request, prepare the copy of the public record and shall not require
the person who has requested the copy to prepare the copy himself
or herself.

33 (i) Any contract, resolution or agreement entered into by a nonprofit organization with a governmental entity, including for 34 purposes of obtaining a governmental benefit or grant, whereby 35 the governmental entity is authorized to or any statute which 36 37 expressly authorizes a governmental entity to inspect the records of the nonprofit organization, including, without limitation, a 38 contract, resolution or agreement entered into pursuant to NRS 39 427A.085, 433.354, 433B.220 or 439.155 or a request for a 40 41 screening submitted pursuant to NRS 179A.325;

42 (j) Any report required to be filed by a nonprofit organization 43 and posted by the Department of Health and Human Services on 44 the Internet website maintained by the Department pursuant to 45 NRS 439B.665 and 439B.670;

4 (1) Any information submitted to a governmental entity by a 5 national securities association that is registered pursuant to 15 6 U.S.C. § 780-3 or any regulation adopted pursuant thereto, 7 including, without limitation, any information submitted to the 8 Secretary of State pursuant to chapters 90 and 91 of NRS and any 9 regulations adopted pursuant thereto for the purposes of licensing, 10 registration, examination, investigation or enforcement;

(m) Any requirement to disclose the relationship between a public officer or employee and a nonprofit organization pursuant to NRS 281A.420, as a response to a lawful request or subpoena in an investigation or as part of or in response to a request for an advisory opinion submitted pursuant to NRS 281A.670 to 281A.690, inclusive, or an ethics complaint filed or initiated pursuant to NRS 281A.700 to 281A.790, inclusive;

(n) Any information submitted to or requested by the Nevada
Gaming Control Board pursuant to NRS 462.160 for the purposes
of the licensing or registration of a charitable lottery or charitable
game, provided that any information collected is confidential as
provided in NRS 463.120;

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(o) A request for information:

(1) Required by the Attorney General for an audit,
examination, review or investigation conducted pursuant to NRS
82.536, provided that:

27 (I) Such information must only be used in connection 28 with the specific audit, examination, review or investigation to 29 which the request is related and for any related proceedings; and

30 (II) Such information otherwise remains subject to the 31 provisions of this section, unless expressly required by law to be 32 publicly disclosed;

 confidential unless its disclosure is expressly required by law to be
 publicly disclosed or is necessary to publicize in a court pleading
 or submission of evidence to a court; or
 (4) Connected with a constituent complaint submitted to the
 Attorney General; and
 (p) The names of members of a labor organization and the

8 amount of dues collected by a governmental entity that are 9 provided to the labor organization for the purposes of collecting 10 and reporting the remittance of dues to the labor organization 11 from its members, in accordance with a valid authorization to 12 withhold dues.

4. Any person who alleges that the person has been harmed
by a governmental entity or an officer or employee of a
governmental entity that has violated the provisions of subsection
1 or 2 may bring a civil action in a court of competent jurisdiction.
If the person prevails, the person is entitled to receive any or all of
the following relief:

(a) Injunctive relief as the court deems appropriate;

20 (b) Costs incurred in bringing the action, including, without 21 limitation, reasonable attorney's fees;

(c) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (d), the greater
 of actual damages or statutory damages equal to:

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(1) For a first offense, \$1,000;
(2) For a second offense, \$5,000; and

(3) For a third or any subsequent offense, \$10,000.

(d) If the court determines that a governmental entity or
officer or employee of a governmental entity acted recklessly or
willfully to violate the provisions of this section, the court may
award treble the amount of the damages assessed pursuant to
paragraph (c).

32 5. For the purposes of this section, "personal information 33 that identifies a person as a donor, member or volunteer of a 34 nonprofit organization":

(a) Includes, without limitation, any list, record, register,
roster or other data of any kind that includes a donation, name,
address or telephone number that directly or indirectly identifies a
person as a donor of financial or nonfinancial support, member or
volunteer of any nonprofit organization; and

40 (b) Does not include information that identifies a person as a 41 staff member, employee or contractor of a nonprofit organization.

A corporation for public benefit and a corporation 19 holding assets in charitable trust is subject at all times to 20 examination by the Attorney General, on behalf of the State, to 21 ascertain the condition of its affairs and to what extent, if at all, it 22 fails to comply with trusts it has assumed or has departed from the 23 purposes for which it is formed. In case of any such a failure or 24 departure, the Attorney General may institute, in the name of the 25 State, the proceeding necessary to correct the noncompliance or 26 departure.

The Attorney General, or any person given the status of 27 2. 28 relator by the Attorney General, may bring an action to enjoin, 29 correct, obtain damages for or otherwise to remedy a breach of a 30 charitable trust or departure from the purposes for which it is 31 formed.

32 *3*. Any information collected by the Attorney General 33 pursuant to this section:

(a) Must only be used in connection with an audit, 34 35 examination, review or investigation by the Attorney General and 36 for any proceedings or action resulting from such an audit, 37 examination, review or investigation; and

38 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection and section 2 of this act, is subject to the requirements of section 2 of this act, 39 40 unless expressly required by law to be publicly disclosed.
