## ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 20–COMMITTEE ON GROWTH AND INFRASTRUCTURE

# (ON BEHALF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES)

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to the Department of Motor Vehicles. (BDR 43-305)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to the Department of Motor Vehicles; authorizing the imprinting of individualized symbols or codes for different medical conditions on driver's licenses or identification cards; providing for the use of electronic mail for certain communications concerning liability insurance; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

### Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law authorizes the Department of Motor Vehicles to adopt regulations establishing a program for the imprinting of a symbol indicating a medical condition on a driver's license or identification card. If such a program is adopted, existing law: (1) requires the Department to adopt a single symbol to indicate that a person has a medical condition; and (2) prohibits the Department from adopting individualized symbols for different medical conditions. (NRS 483.3485, 483.863) **Sections 1 and 2** of this bill authorize the Department to adopt individualized symbols or codes for different medical conditions in addition to adopting the required single symbol to indicate that a person has a medical condition.

10 Existing law requires the Department to mail to the registered owner of a motor 11 vehicle a request for information regarding the liability insurance covering the 12 motor vehicle, if the Department is unable to verify that the motor vehicle is 13 covered by a policy of liability insurance. If the Department does not receive the 14 requested information, existing law requires the Department to suspend the registration of the motor vehicle after sending a notice of suspension of registration 15 16 by certified mail. (NRS 485.317) Section 3 of this bill additionally authorizes the 17 Department to send a request for information regarding liability insurance coverage 18 by electronic mail, if the registered owner has elected to receive information from





19 the Department by electronic mail. Section 3 also requires the Department to send a notice of suspension of registration by electronic mail, if the registered owner has

20 21 22 elected to receive information from the Department by electronic mail, in addition

- to sending the notice by certified mail.

#### THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

#### 1 Section 1. NRS 483.3485 is hereby amended to read as 2 follows: 3 483.3485 1. The Department regulations may adopt 4 establishing a program for the imprinting of a symbol indicating a 5 medical condition on a driver's license issued by the Department. 6 If the Department establishes a program pursuant to 2. 7 subsection 1: (a) [Except as otherwise provided in this title, the] The 8 9 Department shall adopt a single symbol for imprinting on a driver's license to indicate a medical condition and [shall not] may also 10 11 adopt individualized symbols or codes for different medical 12 conditions. 13 (b) The regulations adopted by the Department must provide 14 that a person is eligible to have the symbol indicating a medical condition imprinted on his or her driver's license if the person is: 15 (1) On anticoagulants; or 16 17 (2) A person with: 18 (I) Diabetes; 19 (II) Epilepsy; (III) Blindness and low vision: 20 21 (IV) Deafness; 22 (V) Coronary atherosclerosis; (VI) Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease; 23 24 (VII) A food allergy; (VIII) Malignant hyperthermia; 25 26 (IX) Sickle cell disease; 27 (X) Systemic lupus erythematosus; (XI) Heart disease: 28 29 (XII) Hemophilia; 30 (XIII) Schizophrenia; 31 (XIV) Depression; or 32 (XV) A mental illness. 33 (c) The Department shall maintain a record of the medical 34 condition for which the symbol indicating a medical condition was imprinted on the driver's license of an eligible person. The record 35 must be maintained in the same location and manner as all other 36

records relating to the driver's license of the person, including, 37





1 without limitation, the records relating to the driver's license of the 2 person that are made available to law enforcement agencies. If 3 the Department maintains such information in the form of a code, 4 the code used must conform with the International Classification of 5 Diseases, Ninth Revision, Clinical Modification, or the most current 6 revision, adopted by the National Center for Health Statistics and 7 the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

8 (d) The Department shall maintain on the Internet website of the 9 Department information about the program established pursuant to 10 subsection 1, including, without limitation, the manner in which a person may obtain a driver's license which has been imprinted with 11 12 a symbol indicating a medical condition.

13 (e) The regulations adopted by the Department may provide that 14 a person is eligible to have the symbol indicating a medical 15 condition imprinted on his or her driver's license to indicate such 16 other medical conditions not listed in paragraph (b) as the 17 Department deems appropriate. The Department shall provide a 18 means for members of the public to suggest additional medical 19 conditions for inclusion in the regulations adopted by the 20 Department.

21 3. The Department may apply for and accept any gift, grant, 22 appropriation or other donation to assist in carrying out a program 23 established pursuant to the provisions of this section. 24

Sec. 2. NRS 483.863 is hereby amended to read as follows:

25 483.863 1. The Department may adopt regulations 26 establishing a program for the imprinting of a symbol indicating a 27 medical condition on an identification card issued by the 28 Department.

29 2. If the Department establishes a program pursuant to 30 subsection 1:

(a) [Except as otherwise provided in this title, the] The 31 32 Department shall adopt a single symbol for imprinting on an 33 identification card to indicate a medical condition and [shall not] 34 *may also* adopt individualized symbols *or codes* for different 35 medical conditions.

36 (b) The regulations adopted by the Department must provide 37 that a person is eligible to have the symbol indicating a medical 38 condition imprinted on his or her identification card if the person is:

- (1) On anticoagulants; or (2) A person with:
- 41 42
- (I) Diabetes;
  - (II) Epilepsy;
  - (III) Blindness and low vision;
- (IV) Deafness; (V) Coronary atherosclerosis;

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- 1 (VI) Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease;
- 2 (VII) A food allergy;
- 3 (VIII) Malignant hyperthermia;
- 4 (IX) Sickle cell disease;
- 5 (X) Systemic lupus erythematosus;
- 6 (XI) Heart disease;
- 7 (XII) Hemophilia;
- 8 (XIII) Schizophrenia;
- 9
- (XIV) Depression; or
- 10 (XV) A mental illness.

(c) The Department shall maintain a record of the medical 11 12 condition for which the symbol indicating a medical condition was 13 imprinted on the identification card of an eligible person. The record 14 must be maintained in the same location and manner as all other 15 records relating to the identification card of the person, including, 16 without limitation, the records relating to the identification card of 17 the person that are available to law enforcement agencies. If the 18 Department maintains such information in the form of a code, the 19 code used must conform with the International Classification of 20 Diseases, Ninth Revision, Clinical Modification, or the most current 21 revision, adopted by the National Center for Health Statistics and 22 the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

(d) The Department shall, at the time of the issuance or renewal
of an identification card, give the holder the opportunity to have
imprinted on his or her identification card a symbol indicating a
medical condition.

(e) The Department shall maintain on the Internet website of the
Department information about the program established pursuant to
subsection 1, including, without limitation, the manner in which a
person may obtain an identification card which has been imprinted
with a symbol indicating a medical condition.

32 (f) The regulations adopted by the Department may provide that a person is eligible to have the symbol indicating a medical 33 34 condition imprinted on his or her identification card to indicate such 35 other medical conditions not listed in paragraph (b) as the Department deems appropriate. The Department shall provide a 36 37 means for members of the public to suggest additional medical 38 conditions for inclusion in the regulations adopted by the 39 Department.

3. The Department may apply for and accept any gift, grant,
appropriation or other donation to assist in carrying out a program
established pursuant to the provisions of this section.



Sec. 3. NRS 485.317 is hereby amended to read as follows:

485.317 1. The Department shall verify that each motor
vehicle which is registered in this State is covered by a policy of
liability insurance as required by NRS 485.185.

5 2. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the 6 Department may use any information to verify whether a motor 7 vehicle is covered by a policy of liability insurance as required by 8 NRS 485.185. The Department may not use the name of the owner 9 of a motor vehicle as the primary means of verifying that a motor 10 vehicle is covered by a policy of liability insurance.

11 3. If the Department is unable to verify that a motor vehicle is 12 covered by a policy of liability insurance as required by NRS 13 485.185, the Department shall send a request for information by 14 first-class mail or, if the registered owner of the motor vehicle has elected to receive information from the Department by electronic 15 16 *mail, by electronic mail* to the registered owner of the motor 17 vehicle. The owner shall submit all the information which is 18 requested to the Department within 15 days after the date on which 19 the request for information was *mailed sent* by the Department. If 20 the Department does not receive the requested information within 15 21 days after it *mailed* sent the request to the owner, the Department 22 shall send to the owner a notice of suspension of registration by 23 certified mail [] and, if the owner has elected to receive 24 information from the Department by electronic mail, by electronic 25 *mail.* The notice must inform the owner that unless the Department 26 is able to verify that the motor vehicle is covered by a policy of 27 liability insurance as required by NRS 485.185 within 10 days after 28 the date on which the notice was sent by the Department, the 29 owner's registration will be suspended pursuant to subsection 4.

4. The Department shall suspend the registration and require the return to the Department of the license plates of any vehicle for which the Department cannot verify the coverage of liability insurance required by NRS 485.185.

5. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 6, the Department shall reinstate the registration of the vehicle and reissue the license plates only upon verification of current insurance and compliance with the requirements for reinstatement of registration prescribed in paragraph (a) of subsection 7 of NRS 482.480.

6. If the Department suspends the registration of a motor vehicle pursuant to subsection 4 because the registered owner of the motor vehicle failed to have insurance on the date specified in the form for verification, and if the registered owner, in accordance with regulations adopted by the Department, proves to the satisfaction of the Department that the owner was unable to comply with the provisions of NRS 485.185 on that date because of extenuating



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circumstances or that the motor vehicle was a dormant vehicle and
 the owner failed to cancel the registration in accordance with
 subsection 3 of NRS 485.320, the Department may:

4 (a) Reinstate the registration of the motor vehicle and reissue the
5 license plates upon payment by the registered owner of a fee of \$50,
6 which must be deposited in the Account for Verification of
7 Insurance created by subsection 7 of NRS 482.480; or

8 (b) Remove the suspension of the registration without the 9 payment of a fee or administrative fine.

10  $\rightarrow$  The Department shall adopt regulations to carry out the 11 provisions of this subsection.

12 Sec. 4. 1. This section becomes effective upon passage and 13 approval.

14 2. Sections 1 and 2 of this act become effective:

(a) Upon passage and approval for the purpose of adopting any
 regulations and performing any other preparatory administrative

17 tasks that are necessary to carry out the provisions of this act; and

18 (b) On October 1, 2025, for all other purposes.

19 3. Section 3 of this act becomes effective on October 1, 2025.

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
