SENATE BILL NO. 147-SENATOR DONDERO LOOP

SUMMARY—Creates the Southern Nevada Regional Planning for Economic Resiliency Pilot Program. (BDR S-683)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact. Effect on the State: Contains Appropriation not included in Executive Budget.

EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets formitted material is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to regional planning; establishing the Advisory Committee on Regional Planning for Economic Resiliency; creating the Southern Nevada Regional Planning for Economic Resiliency Pilot Program; making an appropriation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

This bill establishes the Southern Nevada Regional Planning for Economic Resiliency Pilot Program. Section 7 of this bill requires the Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada to establish the Advisory Committee on Regional Planning for Economic Resiliency to assist the Commission in carrying out the provisions of sections 1-10 of this bill. Section 8 creates the Program to: (1) evaluate the current regional planning process and the existing and future priorities and needs in the region of Clark County, Nevada, with a focus on infrastructure projects, transit services and economic development and redevelopment projects; and (2) identify sources of federal, state and other money that will support the continued infrastructure, transit and economic needs of the region. Section 9 requires the Advisory Committee to conduct the Program with a focus on certain population centers in the region and to study and perform community outreach on issues relating to regional planning for economic development and resiliency in the region.

Section 10 requires: (1) the Advisory Committee to prepare a regional infrastructure plan for economic growth and resiliency in the region and a written report describing the activities, findings, conclusions and recommendations of the Advisory Committee; and (2) the Commission to transmit a copy of the plan and report to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the Joint Interim Standing Committee on Government Affairs.

Sections 2-6 define certain terms relating to the Program. Section 1 applies these definitions to the provisions of **sections 1-10**.

Section 11 of this bill makes an appropriation to the Commission to establish and implement the Program and for a staff member to assist in the Program and to carry out the provisions of **sections 1-10**.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** As used in sections 1 to 10, inclusive, of this act, unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in sections 2 to 6, inclusive, of this act have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.
- **Sec. 2.** "Advisory Committee" means the Advisory Committee on Regional Planning for Economic Resiliency established pursuant to section 7 of this act.
- **Sec. 3.** "Commission" means the Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada.
- **Sec. 4.** "Program" means the Southern Nevada Regional Planning for Economic Resiliency Pilot Program created by section 8 of this act.
- **Sec. 5.** "Project" means any structure, facility, undertaking or system which a local government is authorized to acquire, improve, equip, maintain or operate, which may consist of all kinds of personal and real property.
 - Sec. 6. "Region" means Clark County, Nevada.
- **Sec. 7.** 1. The Commission shall establish the Advisory Committee on Regional Planning for Economic Resiliency to assist the Commission in carrying out the provisions of sections 1 to 10, inclusive, of this act.
- 2. The Commission shall appoint at least five members to the Advisory Committee which must be comprised of various stakeholders in the region who must have experience in regional planning, economic development or redevelopment, workforce development, infrastructure development or transit services.
- 3. Each member of the Advisory Committee serves a term of 2 years.
- 4. The Advisory Committee shall elect a Chair and Vice Chair from among its members at the first meeting of the Advisory Committee.
- 5. A majority of the members of the Advisory Committee constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business, and a majority of those members present at any meeting is sufficient for any official action taken by the Advisory Committee.
- 6. Each member of the Advisory Committee serves without compensation and is not entitled to receive a per diem allowance or travel expenses.





- 7. The Commission shall provide the Advisory Committee with such administrative and staff support as is necessary to assist the Advisory Committee in carrying out its duties set forth in sections 1 to 10, inclusive, of this act.
- **Sec. 8.** 1. The Southern Nevada Regional Planning for Economic Resiliency Pilot Program is hereby created as a pilot program to support and sustain the economic resiliency of the region by:
- (a) Evaluating the current regional planning process and the existing and future priorities and needs in the region, with a focus on infrastructure projects, transit services and economic development and redevelopment projects; and
- (b) Identifying sources of federal, state and other money that will support the continued infrastructure, transit and economic needs of the growing population in the region.
- 2. The Commission shall, in coordination with the Advisory Committee, oversee the Program.
- **Sec. 9.** 1. The Advisory Committee shall conduct the Program to study and perform community outreach on issues relating to regional planning for economic development and resiliency in the region with a focus on the following population centers:
 - (a) Las Vegas;

- (b) Henderson;
- (c) North Las Vegas;
- (d) Boulder City;
- (e) Mesquite; and
- (f) Any other urbanized section of the Las Vegas Valley.
- 2. The Program conducted pursuant to subsection 1 must, without limitation:
- (a) Identify existing, planned and proposed areas for economic development, redevelopment and diversification, including, without limitation, redevelopment areas, existing underserved neighborhoods with opportunities for reinvestment, opportunity zones, job creation zones, Southern Nevada Strong opportunity sites, areas identified in the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy for Southern Nevada developed by the Las Vegas Global Economic Alliance, innovation districts, large-scale industrial areas, any activity centers identified in the most recent regional plan developed by Southern Nevada Strong, parcels with transit-oriented development or mixed-use zoning, activity centers identified by the Brookings Institution and any areas with major development;
- (b) Review existing plans for the population centers identified in subsection 1 for capital improvements and other planning efforts and, based on such plans, identify economic development centers





with planned infrastructure projects and transit services, which may be at any stage in the planning process, and any unfunded needs with regards to those planned infrastructure projects and transit services;

- (c) Develop and implement a community outreach plan to:
 - (1) Increase community support of regional planning;
- (2) Build regional agreement on a list of economic development and redevelopment projects determined by the Advisory Committee to be regionally significant and which support community goals, such as attracting target industries, diversifying the economy or locating jobs and housing within the same location; and
- (3) Garner community input regarding infrastructure projects and transit services that are regionally significant and necessary to support the region;
- (d) Develop estimates of planning costs that include capital, operations and maintenance and infrastructure design, construction and maintenance:
- (e) Complete a high-level evaluation of the benefits of infrastructure projects and transit services that support the economic development and redevelopment priorities identified in the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy for Southern Nevada and the most recent regional plan developed by Southern Nevada Strong;
- (f) In coordination with key stakeholders in the region identified by the Advisory Committee, develop additional criteria to evaluate economic development and redevelopment projects in the region;
- (g) Develop packages of infrastructure projects and transit services, which identify for each package, project and service, the costs and benefits, current stage of development, resources already committed and any additional money needed;
- (h) Facilitate consensus with stakeholders in the region on a prioritized list of infrastructure projects and transit services that support the economic development and redevelopment centers and projects that the Advisory Committee has determined are regionally significant;
- (i) Identify packages of economic development and redevelopment projects that could be submitted for federal grants and, if feasible, prepare an application for grants for any such package;
- (j) Evaluate the regional planning development process and determine the steps and resources needed to continue regional coordination of infrastructure projects, transit services, economic development and redevelopment projects and the methods to obtain grants for such projects and services; and





(k) Identify any lessons learned regarding the regional planning process and regional coordination and opportunities for future improvements.

Sec. 10. On or before June 30, 2027:

- 1. The Advisory Committee shall prepare:
- (a) A regional infrastructure plan for economic growth and resiliency in the region, which must identify, without limitation:
- (1) Infrastructure projects and transit services that support access to existing, planned and proposed economic development and redevelopment centers and projects that the Advisory Committee has determined are regionally significant; and
- (2) Potential federal, state and other resources that may be available to support the projects and services identified pursuant to subparagraph (1); and
- (b) A written report describing the activities, findings, conclusions and recommendations of the Advisory Committee.
- 2. The Commission shall submit a copy of the plan and report prepared pursuant to subsection 1 to the Director of the Legislature Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the Joint Interim Standing Committee on Government Affairs.
- **Sec. 11.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada the sum of \$650,000 to establish and implement the Southern Nevada Regional Planning for Economic Resiliency Pilot Program created by section 8 of this act and for a staff member to assist the Commission and the Advisory Committee on Regional Planning for Economic Resiliency created by section 7 of this act in carrying out the provisions of sections 1 to 10, inclusive, of this act.
- 2. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by subsection 1 must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2027, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after September 17, 2027, by either the entity to which the money was appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General Fund on or before September 17, 2027.
- **Sec. 12.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2025, and expires by limitation on June 30, 2027.
