The Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC) has reviewed AB 105. Section 1 of this bill prohibits a person from possessing or causing a firearm to be present in, or within 100 feet of an entrance to, a place the person knows or reasonably should know is an election site with some exceptions. A person who violates this prohibition is guilty of a gross misdemeanor, except if the person knowingly possesses a firearm or causes a firearm to be present with the specific intent to disrupt, interfere with or monitor the administration of the election or the counting of votes would be guilty of a category D felony.

There is no direct data available for this type of offense at this time. Should this bill become law, the department anticipates not more than two (2) additional admissions of offenders per year. These offenders would have a minimum term of one (1) year.

The department estimates the cost per offender per day to be \$91.43, with an annual cost of \$66,744 for SFY26 and \$66,744 for SFY27 or \$133,488 for future biennia.
