The Nevada Department of Corrections has reviewed SB 122. Sections 1 and 2 prohibit a person from returning a mail ballot on behalf of a voter unless the person is a resident of this State and requires that any person who returns a ballot on behalf of a voter submit with the mail ballot an affirmation that attests to the same. A person who violates this prohibition would be guilty of a category E felony. After reviewing sentencing information for admissions, releases, and populations from 2022-2024, the department found no records of offenders coming to NDOC custody under the affected statutes. Additionally, Category E felonies are eligible for probation.

As written, the NDOC does not see any potential impact to population levels and no fiscal impact is noted.
