SB110 / BDR 15-57 AN ACT relating to sex trafficking; revising the penalties for the commission of the crime of facilitating sex trafficking; and other matters.

Existing law establishes certain acts that constitute the crime of facilitating sex trafficking and sets forth the penalties imposed upon a person who is found guilty of facilitating sex trafficking. Under existing law, such penalties vary depending on whether the victim is an adult or a child. (NRS 201.301) This bill increases the minimum and maximum terms of imprisonment for a person found guilty of facilitating sex trafficking.

If this bill as introduced is enacted, it would require the Department of Public Safety, Records, Communications and Compliance Division (RCCD), Nevada Offense Code Unit (NOC) staff to repeal 2 NOCs and create 6 sub-types and 6 NOCs. However, the cumulative impact of the legislation from the 2025 session will increase the volume of NOC revisions. The RCCD may request to return to the Interim Finance Committee in the 2025-2027 biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
