BDR 16-500 (AB91) allows the Parole Board to grant a "second look" parole to certain persons. The bill becomes effective upon passage and approval for the purpose of adopting regulations and performing administrative tasks, and on January 1, 2026, for all other purposes.

As this bill could allow additional parole grants on those eligible for a "second look", any increase of parole grants will require additional supervision officers. The Division does not possess the necessary data to estimate the number of increased parole grants to determine whether the increase could be absorbed by existing staff or would require additional staff. Therefore, the total impact of this bill cannot be determined at this time. The agency reserves the right to go to the Interim Finance Committee for the future biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
