The Nevada Department of Corrections has reviewed AB 25 (BDR 16-296). Section 1 of this bill requires certain medical examinations be provided in accordance with community standards of care and national guidelines for the provision of such services by removing the language requiring "annual" exams. In the 82nd session of the Nevada Legislature, AB 292 included an annual pelvic examination and mammography, which was codified into law. An amendment was offered but not included to remove the "annual" requirement and align with community standards for the frequency of each examination. NDOC has mirrored community standards of care outlined in United States Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) and the American College of Gynecology (ACG) as a baseline for services offered to offenders in custody. Should AB25 (BDR 16-296) pass as written, any cost increase from AB 292 adoption would become null. Passage of AB 251 would eliminate the need for Decision Unit E270 currently in the Governor Recommends G01 budget for Budget Account 3706 NDOC Medical.

As a result of the passage of AB 292 in the 82nd Session, NDOC made the adjustment in treatment access. (See Medical Directive 130 and 135). Approval and passage of AB 25 (BDR 16-296) would eliminate the need for additional funding as outlined above.
