The Nevada Department of Corrections has reviewed AB 150. Section 1 reaffirms that it is unlawful to intimidate a tribal judge. Sections 2 and 3 expand the definition of protected persons in assault and battery cases. Sections 4, 5, and 6 expand the ability for tribal judges to obtain court orders.

The department had identified 19 Tribal Courts present in Nevada. With a limited number of tribal judges present, cases of assault, battery, and intimidation are not anticipated to impact offender population significantly. There have been relatively few admissions between 2022 and 2024 for assault or battery of a protected person, or for intimidation of a public officer. The department does not anticipate this bill to have fiscal impact as written at this time.
