BDR 40-905 (SB153) revises provisions relating to certain crimes involving controlled substances. If someone sells, gives, trades or otherwise makes available fentanyl, which results in the death of the recipient, it can be charged as First-Degree Murder. Does not require proof that the drug was the sole cause of death but must be a primary cause. The bill becomes effective upon passage and approval.

The agency has reviewed the bill and determined that as this bill is creating a new crime in statute, any arrest and subsequent conviction would require additional pre-sentence investigation staff and supervision officers. The division does not possess the necessary data to estimate a number of convictions to determine whether the increase could be absorbed by existing staff or would require additional staff. Therefore, the total impact of this bill cannot be determined at this time. The agency reserves the right to go to the Interim Finance Committee for the future biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
