BDR 15-776 expands upon the crime of Unlawful Dissemination of an Intimate Image to include certain acts relating to the distribution of certain photo-realistic images, digital images, electronic images, computer images, computer-generated images, and other pictorial representations. It also expands the definition of "intimate image" and provides that the crime of Unlawful Dissemination of an Intimate Image constitutes a sexual offense for the purposes of various statutes. The bill becomes effective October 1, 2025.

The division has reviewed this BDR and determined that this BDR will expand the scope of the crime of Unlawful Dissemination of an Intimate Image, any arrest and subsequent convictions involving the new prohibited material, would require additional pre-sentence investigation staff and supervision officers. The division does not possess the necessary data to estimate a number of convictions to determine whether the increase could be absorbed by existing staff or would require additional staff. Therefore, the total impact of this bill cannot be determined at this time. The agency reserves the right to go to the Interim Finance Committee for the future biennium should workload increases necessitate additional staffing.
