Explanation

BDR 14-208 (AB151) provides that a person convicted of solicitation of a child for prostitution is a Tier II offender for the purposes of sex offender registration and community notification; providing that committing the crime of solicitation of prostitution under certain circumstances constitutes a sexual offense for the purposes of various provisions. The bill becomes effective July 1, 2025.

The Division has reviewed this BDR and determined that this bill proposes the addition of language to NRS 201.354 section 2 Solicitation of Prostitution involving a child, a peace officer posing as a child or a person who is assisting in an investigation on behalf of a peace officer posing as a child as included in the list of crimes against a child, under NRS 179D.0357, which will not have a significant impact on the operations of the Division. The addition of NRS 201.354 Solicitation of Prostitution to the list of sexual offenses under NRS 179D.097 will have a foreseeable impact. The inclusion of a new NRS under the header of sexual offenses could increase the number of psychosexual evaluations (PSE). The PSE will not be mandatory but is discretionary upon agreement between the defendant and the prosecuting attorney. The Division is currently responsible for finding providers for PSE's and for paying for the PSE. The Division does not possess the necessary data to estimate how many PSEs will be requested to determine whether the increase could be absorbed in the current budget category that covers them or if additional funding will be required. Therefore, the total impact of this bill cannot be determined at this time. The agency reserves the right to go to the Interim Finance Committee for the future biennium should the increase necessitate additional funding.
