The Nevada Gaming Control Board ("NGCB") has reviewed A.B. 58 and identified fiscal impacts.

Although there is a calculation regarding Section 1 of A.B. 58, the NGCB will not move forward with its proposal in Section 1 regarding the removal of dice, playing cards, and devices for weighing or counting money from the definition of "associated equipment." The proposed amendment of "associated equipment" would remove entities associated with cards, dice, and devices for weighing or counting money, from registering as "associated equipment" manufacturers, thus reducing NGCB revenue. The average impact in FYs 26 and 27 is \$12,100; the average five-year impact is \$60,500; the average future impact is \$24,200.

In Sections 3, 5, 7, and 11, the NGCB proposes to repeal the term "cash access and wagering instrument service provider" from statute. The proposed repeal of this term would no longer require these entities to register with the NGCB as "cash access and wagering instrument service provider[s]," thus reducing NGCB revenue. The average impact in FYs 26 and 27 is \$15,400; the average five-year impact is \$77,000; the average future impact is \$30,800.
