Comment: If passed, this bill would likely carry significant costs for Washoe County School District, both in terms of (1) the time to determine the gender of a student at birth and (2) the ability for families to sue for noncompliance with this bill. In addition to the increased legal exposure for the District related to the second issue, there could be litigation resulting from a denial of a student's ability to participate in sports as the gender an athlete identifies with. There is no way for the District to estimate these costs at this time.

Comment: SB 112 would require certain schools to designate by sex the athletic teams and sports sponsored by the schools and prohibit male or female athletes from competing on teams designated for the other sex. Although section 5 states that this does not constitute discrimination on the basis of sex or gender identity or expression under any state statute or local ordinance, it may not comply with federal civil rights and Title IX regulations. This bill has the potential to impact administrative costs, legal expenses, and training and education. There may also be effects on eligibility requirements for Title IX and other federal grant programs that could jeopardize funding. At this point, the only fiscal impact we can quantify is the need for training and education to implement the new provisions.
